Dear FFA Supporter,

The Owego FFA chapter will be hosting the FFA District 7 Leadership Development Event on February 8th at Owego Elementary School. For the event to run smoothly we need qualified judges to evaluate each event. We would like to formally invite you or a representative from your organization to judge an event.

The events are judged by a panel of three judges. The top placing members/teams from each event will advance to the Sub-state Event at Adirondak High School on March 15th. From there, the top candidates will be eligible to compete at State Convention. As judges, you will evaluate FFA members who have put a lot of hard work, dedication and commitment into preparing for the leadership events in which they are participating. Your job is to select the members who have prepared themselves and their materials the best for this event.

All judges are asked to be present by 7:45am on February 8th at the Owego Elementary School for an orientation before the events begin. We will also host a Zoom meeting the week before the event to provide you with additional information, make sure you know where to find the rules to review ahead of time and to answer any questions you might have. Once everyone has registered, we will send out the Zoom link. Contests will officially start at 9:00 am, and are usually completed by 3:00 pm, if everything moves along smoothly. When your event is done, we ask that you report to the judge's room to submit your results. The awards are then given out and you are free to leave. This is a learning experience, and members do benefit from hearing direct input from you. They may ask you questions if you make yourself available.

The FSA office completed its acreage reporting for small grains and cover crops. We continue to work on getting maps together for spring but won't be mailing to producers until sometime in April. If you should need maps early to help prioritize your plantings, just give us a call here at the office and we'd be more than happy to send them to you.

Without having a new farm bill, we still have not heard anything about a 2025 Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) signup. We anxiously await but do anticipate an extension of the program.

If you are in the market for a new skid steer, hay wagon or any type of handling equipment "once the crop is off the field", we've got you covered. Also, if you need any additional grain, hay or even cold storage, Farm Service Agency is here for you. NYS has approved that a \$25,000 or less loan does not require a financial analysis. Bring a quote to the office and file an application with \$100 application fee and we can have your loan closed in no time at all. Loans on used equipment can have up to a 5-year term, while anything new under \$100,000 can go up to a 7-year term. Call the office today for more information!
