- APPROVAL OF MINUTES
 - A motion to approve the minutes as submitted for March 10, 2022 was made by Mr. Ciotoli, 2nd by Mrs. Roberts. All in favor. Motion Carried.
- FINANCIAL
 - > YTD Budget Summary was shared with the committee. The department is currently well under budget.
- OLD BUSINESS
 - Mr. Hammond stated that a meeting regarding the wage rates of CDL drivers was held. Mr. Hammond made a proposal to increase wages for CDL drivers by 2 pay grades. The Personnel Director will be drafting a resolution to be submitted at both DPW and Personnel Committees in May. The committee gave their approval to move forward with this.
- NEW BUSINESS
 - > Mr. Hammond reported on Buildings and Grounds.
 - ED&P offices remodel at 56 Main Street is currently on hold until the HVAC system is installed. Mr. Perkins stated that this will be going out to

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bid tomorrow. There is a possibility that bids will come in higher than what was budgeted.

- New carpet was installed in the waiting room, Courtroom and Judge's Chambers in the Court Annex.
- New controls were installed on half of the AC/Heat at the HHS Building. The system failed and a new company was hired to repair it.
- Snow removal was done at all buildings.
- Storage items and shelves were moved from the Records building into the Stone Building to make room for a high density storage system.
- Room 1132 was painted in the HHS Building.
- 2 work stations were moved in the HHS Building.
- White boards were hung at Mental Health Waverly and the HHS Building.
- Fire drills were executed at the Court House, Court Annex and HHS Buildings.
- New double metal doors were installed on the garage at the PSB Building.
- > Mr. Hammond reported on the Highway Department.
 - Sanding and plowing operations are ongoing.
 - Sand is being hauled in to mix with the road salt.
 - We have entered into a shared services agreement with NYSDOT to utilize their truck washing facility.
 - Some road side reparations are being done to repair wing damage.
 - Tree trimming operations are obgoing.
- > Mr. Perkins gave an update on the Capital Projects
 - Bridge Preventative Maintenance Phase VIII is out to bid.
 - Wash Bay Facility is currently on hold.
 - Harnick Road Bridge is under preliminary design by Delta Engineers.
 - The Culvert Program is under preliminary design in our office.
 - HVAC Controls at the HHS Building and the Chiller at the Public Safety Building are both expected to be out to bid next month.
 - Michigan Hollow Road Culvert is currently under preliminary design.
 - We have hired a contractor for Talcott Street Pier Repairs. A preconstruction meeting is scheduled in a couple weeks.
 - We are waiting for a DEC permit for Park Settlement Road bridge repairs.
 - Corporate Drive reconstruction is under design in our office.
- PERSONNEL
 - Mr. Hammond stated that we are submitting a resolution to hire a temporary Auto Mechanic II. Our Mechanic/Working Supervisor is currently

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on leave. We would like to increase the hourly wage on the resolution to the CSEA wage for Auto Mechanic II of \$18.96. Mr. Hammond indicated that we should be able to absorb this within our current budget. The committee gave their approval to move forward with this.
