Committee Chair, Legislator Barb Roberts called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M.

 - Providing support to Economic Development with environmental compliance and local approvals for the new Village of Owego DRI projects, as well as environmental compliance for two of the three Property Development Corporation demolition projects.
 - SEQR evaluations made on new 911 telecommunication towers implemented in the County. See four resolutions listed below.
 - Provided assistance on several grants: DOS Local Government Efficiency Program/ITCS Shared Services, Empire State Development Planning and Feasibility Study Program, and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant programs.

Ms. Woodburn asked this committee if the County would be open to being an applicant for CDBG funding specifically for housing rehab in the future with the Land Bank acting as the administrator of the program funds. After some the discussion, this committee was in support of the program.

The Tioga County Planning Board (TCPB) is made up of representatives from each of the nine towns in the county, plus the two largest villages, Owego and Waverly. Currently, the TCPB has vacant positions from the Towns of Spencer, Richford and Berkshire, as well as from the Village of Waverly.

The Tioga County Planning Board meets on the third Wednesday of the month at 7:00 PM in the Tioga County Health and Human Services Building located at 1062 State Route 38 in Room #2139.
