DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This position is responsible for administering pesticide and herbicide applications at various wetland and project mitigation sites. Work is performed in accordance with applicable policies, practices, and state or federal regulatory guidelines. The work season generally runs from May through September. The incumbent works under the direct supervision of the District Manager. Leeway is allowed for independent judgement. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative only)

- Uses personal protective equipment (PPE) to prepare chemicals for treatment application according to regulatory guidelines;
- Uses PPE to treat greenery or surfaces according to regulatory guidelines;
- Inspects landscaping to recommend and perform treatment needs;
- Measures the effectiveness of pesticide use;
- Operates grounds maintenance equipment;
- Cleans equipment or supplies;
- Prepares, completes, and files all required reports related to pesticide application;
- May perform general landscape duties such as: planting, seeding, mulching, and raking.
