Committee Chair Barb Roberts called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & PLANNING (ED&P): Agenda and attachments previously emailed.

I. MINUTES

A. Approval of minutes from June 4, 2024 – Committee Chair Roberts asked for approval of the minutes from the June 4, 2024, committee meeting. Legislator Mullen made a motion to accept the minutes from the June 4, 2024, meeting, seconded by Legislator Ciotoli. All were in favor.

Ms. Woodburn reported the following:

II. FINANCIAL

A. 2024 Budget - Ms. Woodburn reported the following:

- 1. Economic Development
 - Year-to-Date Budget is tracking.
- 2. Planning
 - Year-to-Date Budget is tracking.
- 3. Sustainability Management
 - Year-to-Date Budget is tracking.

Ms. Woodburn reported that work has begun to put the 2025 budgets together.

III. OLD BUSINESS

A. Reports

1. Tioga County Tourism – Monthly report previously emailed and is in the committee packet.

- 2. Tioga County Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE) Monthly report previously emailed and is in the committee packet.
- 3. Tioga County Soil and Water Conservation District Ms. Walsh, Tioga County Soil and Water; monthly report previously emailed and is in the committee packet. Ms. Walsh reviewed her report, highlighting the Agriculture Program, Hazard Mitigation, Stormwater, the Stream Program, as well as Education and Outreach.
 - Ms. Walsh announced Sundaes at the Farm will be held on July 21st at Frisbie Bros. Farm in Halsey Valley in the town of Spencer, noon – 3:00PM, and extended the invitation to the committee.
 - Ms. Walsh distributed pledge cards from Urban Nutrient Management Practices to protect water quality and to encourage residents to use fertilizer sparingly. Tioga County is running a promotional campaign. If residents complete the pledge card or enter information online, at the end of the year there is an opportunity to receive a free rain barrel and possibly a compost bin.
- 4. Economic Development In keeping with staff reporting, Mr. Umiker, the ED&P Intern, and Ms. Jardine, County Planning Director, are both in attendance. Ms. Woodburn introduced Mr. Umiker. Mr. Umiker reported:
 - Interned with the ED&P Department for his required internship through the Binghamton University (BU) Master of Public Administration Program. Mr. Umiker mentioned at BU he learned about governmental structures and how the policy process works on the local level and has been able to apply this knowledge during his internship.
 - Worked on a complete fleet inventory document encompassing the year of purchase, year, make, model, drivetrain, fuel type, miles per gallon and more. This was one more action needed to earn enough points through the Clean Energy Communities Program for the County to achieve a \$10,000.00 grant.
 - Reviewed local zoning codes, attended educational workshops and was able to work with community organizations gaining a better understanding of the daily work of a public administrator.

He thanked the committee for the opportunity.

Ms. Woodburn introduced Ms. Jardine, County Planning Director.

• Ms. Jardine put together a written report titled, Evolution of the Susquehanna Heritage Area. Ms. Jardine distributed and read the report providing the history and its purpose.

Ms. Woodburn continued to report:

- B. Grants
 - 1. Active Grants The EDP Grant Tracking spreadsheet is in the committee packet.
 - Town of Nichols decided not to move forward with their Comprehensive Plan application and was removed from the spreadsheet.
 - The auditors, Insero, looked over the CDBG documentation for the Neighborhood Depot Project. There were no follow up questions.
- C. Economic/Community Development
 - Village of Owego DRI 10 active projects ongoing. An extension has been received on this program. The new completion date is January 2025; however, expecting most projects to be completed this summer.

- 2. Village of Waverly, NY Forward Projects have been announced for the 4.5M award.
 - a. Met with the Village of Waverly Mayor to discuss next steps in the process as well as the timeline for the projects.
 - b. The Department of State will be sending out letters this week to project sponsors. After that, a meeting will be set up with the Department and State to have a kick-off meeting with ED&P and the Village of Waverly. Projects will not start until contracts are issued. This will take some time before moving forward.
 Also discussed at the meeting were ideas for Two Rivers State Park as well as Land

Also discussed at the meeting were ideas for Two Rivers State Park as well as Lana Bank opportunities and the Pro Housing Communities Program.

- 3. Broadband STN (Southern Tier Network) MIP (Municipal Infrastructure Program) grant application
 - a. STN was funded for buildouts in Newark Valley, Smithboro and the remaining areas in Nichols. We assisted them in connecting with the Newark Valley Fire Department to store their network equipment for this project. There is an interest in making a connection with the Town of Berkshire.
- D. Land Bank
 - 1. 10 Watson Avenue, Newark Valley– Rehabilitation complete. The house is up for sale as a single-family home and will go back on the tax rolls.
 - 2. 121 Providence Street and 32 Lyman Avenue in Waverly Rehabilitation in process. The roof is being replaced on both properties.
 - 3. 81 North Avenue A mixed use building. The 1st and 2nd floors are gutted, working on the 3rd floor. Architectural drawings are being finalized. Hoping to send out for bid this month and get the rehab started.
 - 4. 247 Main St., Owego Rehabilitation should begin in the fall.
- E. Workforce Development Mr. Lanning continues to work on the following:
 - 1. Business Leads Fellowship Program, attended the following virtual training: a. Postsecondary Education Session
 - 2. Talent Supply Table (TST)
 - a. TST Gathering Planning the 2nd annual TST gathering on August 21st, bringing all workforce committees together. This year it will be held at the Owego-Apalachin School; pairing businesses with school districts and developing relationships.
 - 3. School/Career Center Pilot Program- Mr. Lanning assisted on facilitating this program:
 - a. Received end-of-program data from Steve Keator at the Career Center. Met with 30 students, held 13 interest assessments. Worked on resume development, interview prep and job search.
 - b. Met with Jackie Burdick and Steve Keator to discuss end-of-program data and next steps.
- F. Planning Ms. Jardine has been working on the following:
 - 1. Refining the Live Tioga recruitment website with Tourism The site is coming along. Deluge Media is getting photos and video content.
 - 2. Hazard Mitigation Plan update- Spoke about earlier.
 - a. Fourteen of sixteen municipalities have passed adoption resolutions.

- G. Sustainability Management Dr. Pratt continues to work on the following:
 - 1. NYSDEC & Paint Care Program The event held June 29th was very successful. Ms. Pratt will collect data for next month.
 - 2. Casella Continuing discussions on accepting electronic waste at the Owego transfer station.
 - 3. NYPA Continuing discussions on Fast Charging Hub in Park Street lot. There are easement issues to be worked out, more information to follow.

 - 1. Business Administrator position The position has been posted and a few applications have been received; interviews are to begin in July.

Committee Chair Barb Roberts called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & PLANNING (ED&P): Agenda and attachments previously emailed.

I. MINUTES

A. Approval of minutes from July 2, 2024 – Moved to September 3rd committee meeting due to no quorum.

Ms. Woodburn reported the following:

- A. 2024 Budget Ms. Woodburn reported the following:
 - 1. Economic Development
 - Year-to-Date Budget is tracking.

 - Year-to-Date Budget is tracking.

- B. 2025 Budgets Budget reports were in the committee packets. Ms. Woodburn reviewed the following:
 - 1. Economic Development
 - No grant funded positions.
 - The Education Workforce Coordinator position was completed last year; Mr. Lanning moved into the Community Development Specialist position.
 - Increased a couple of line items and decreased one line item to offset.

- No increase to the budget for 2025.
- 2. Planning
 - No grant funded positions.
 - No increase to the 2025 budget.
- 3. Southern Tier 8

• Annual dues increase \$240.00 for 2025; 1.5% increase for maintenance costs. The following information was in the March 2024 ED&P Legislative Committee Meeting Minutes:

ST8 proposed increases to annual dues- Ms. Tinney reported Southern Tier 8 has passed a resolution to increase membership dues for partners in 2025 and 2026. Paid dues for 2024 was \$16,000.00, the increase for 2025 and 2026 follows:

- 4. Snowmobile
 - No increase to the 2025 budget.
- 5. Refuse & Garbage
 - Increased one line item and decreased another to offset.
 - No increase to 2025 budget.
- 6. NY Main Street No grant applications planned for 2025

III. OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS

- A. Reports
 - Tioga County Tourism Becca Maffei, Tioga County Tourism Director, brought her monthly report to the meeting to distribute and reviewed the following: DRI Wayfinding Sign Project, Tioga Antique Trail Campaign, Community Content Project, Outdoor Content Project, Travel Guide, and the Tioga Scenic Drive. Not in the agenda, Ms. Maffei reported:
 - The usual outside agency budget request was made with no increase from last year.
 - Working with Senator O'Mara's office to set up a visit to Tioga County next month to talk about projects completed and focus on the Tioga Antiques Trail, hoping to create interest in getting the highway sign. Ms. Maffei invited the committee and will keep everyone informed.
 - The Sundaes at the Farm event was a success; 1000+ in attendance.
 - Working on events campaign for the fall; promoting live music, etc.
 - 2. Cornell Cooperative Extension- Monthly Report previously emailed and is in the committee packet.
 - 3. Tioga County Soil & Water Conservation District- No report this month.
 - Economic Development In keeping with staff reporting, Ms. Woodburn introduced Casey Yelverton, our new Economic Development Specialist. Ms. Yelverton reported while training with Ms. Schnabl, ED&P Deputy Director, she worked on the following:
 - Attended several meetings.
 - Worked on CFA, as well as NY Main Street grant for 62-64 North Ave.; applications submitted.

- Assisted on the Small Manufacturers Modernization Grant for Tioga Hardwoods.
- Created a business plan for the Main Street application.
- Learning procedures of DRI reimbursement corrections, monthly labor inspections, reviewed Neighborhood Depot payroll.
- Learning GIS mapping and working on state leads as they come in.
- Working on the Newmark Study; provided tours of available properties in Tioga County; Matco, Sanmina, the Victory Building.
 - Ms. Woodburn explained this is the clean energy study the IDA is participating in; an eight-county study looking at available industrial buildings and vacant land trying to gage the Southern Tier's readiness for development.
- Creating a small business resource guide for local businesses or potential business owners showing grant funding opportunities, loan opportunities, small business community resources, tax credits and available sites in Tioga County
- Provided assistance to the Land Bank, took pictures of potential properties, meeting minutes.
- Met with Livingston County ED&P Director; discussed how they have used the Community Development Block Grant Funding and how we could use it in Tioga County; good information was exchanged.

B. Grants

- Active Grants See attached EDP Grant Tracking spreadsheet. Ms. Woodburn highlighted:
 - a. NY SWIMS/Village of Owego public pool Expect to hear about award in September.
 - b. Snowmobile Grant Phase I is complete. Phase II for 2024-2025 season is in process.
 - c. Town of Berkshire Looking to apply to the USDA Community Facilities Program. Because Tioga County is a REAP Zone we get special set-aside funds through this program. This is a grant/loan combination for equipment, such as a mower, tractor, and excavator. We acted as a resource; helped them make the right connections to submit the application.

d. FEMA Hazard Mitigation Plan update – The plan is complete and in the process of being closed out. This will be removed from the spreadsheet next month.
Not on the agenda, Ms. Woodburn reported just hearing about the Restore NY Round VIII awards. The Village of Newark Valley received their full grant award, over \$730,000.00, to rehab 10 Whig Street and 14-16 Whig Street. This is for the build-out of 3 residential apartments and 2 commercial spaces. We provided technical assistance to the Village; however, the funding will not run through the County. Also, Ms. Woodburn reported the County received \$165,000.00 for the rehabilitation of 81 North Ave. This is one of the Land Banks projects. A resolution will be presented next month to accept the funds.

- C. Economic/Community Development
 - 1. Village of Owego DRI 10 active projects are ongoing. Ms. Woodburn highlighted the following:
 - a. Temple Estates, a Bruce Nelson project, located on 130 Temple Street held a ribbon cutting on July 26th. This included 7 new 55+ residential apartments. Working on final reimbursement and close out for this project.
 - b. Elks Lodge Roof replacement project The roof tear off and asbestos abatement will begin this month.
 - 2. Village of Waverly NY Forward
 - a. Nine projects have been assigned to state agencies and contracts will be issued to project sponsors. There are 5 individual businesses and property owners that are going to contract directly with the State, taking us out of that step.
 - b. Setting up meetings with individual project sponsors- Empire State Development reached out and asked if we would help guide the others through the process.
 - 3. Broadband STN MIP grant application
 - a. STN was funded for buildouts in Newark Valley, Smithboro and the remaining parts of Nichols. Contract with ESD in process.
 - b. Setting up meetings with STN and Town of Berkshire, Town of Owego and Town of Barton to discuss future opportunities.
 - 4. Pro-Housing Communities
 - a. Town of Berkshire, Town of Newark Valley and Village of Owego- Certification applications are in process.

b. Sent information to Village of Waverly.

Ms. Woodburn reported that the Village of Nichols is also looking to submit a letter of intent for this program.

5. Foundation Coalition

a. Setting up meetings with the local foundations- Mr. Lanning will meet with each foundation to discuss funding priorities and timelines for next year. A meeting will be coordinated with all the foundations in December.

6. Small Business Resource Guide- Ms. Yelverton spoke about working on this earlier.

- D. Land Bank
 - 1. 10 Watson Ave, Newark Valley Rehabilitation is complete; in the process of closing out the project and getting a certificate of occupancy.
 - 2. 121 Providence St, Waverly- Roof replacement in process; demolishing the shed and garage.
 - 32 Lyman Ave, Waverly Roof replacement complete and floors are being repaired.
 - 4. 81 North Avenue/247 Main St, Owego Rehabilitation in process. The architectural drawings are complete for 81 North Ave. and is out for bid.

Ms. Woodburn reported working on the Land Bank budget for next year. There are a couple of Land Bank initiative grant funding sources we will look into for new projects.

- E. Workforce Development
 - 1. Business Leads Fellowship Program- Mr. Lanning continues to participate in this program.

a. Talent Pipeline Management- Session taken and completed.

This program is close to being over. Mr. Lanning has made professional connections and found the program useful.

2. Talent Supply Table (TST)

a. TST Gathering to be held August 21st, planning has begun.

- 3. Congressionally Directed Funding request from OACSD This is for the build-out of the Regional Education and Training Center in the former Owego-Apalachin maintenance building.
 - a. Moved to the next stage of the draft Senate Appropriations Bill for their milliondollar request. They are also working with Mr. Lanning to submit a grant opportunity through Southern Tier 8 for another \$500,000.00 for this project.
- F. Planning
 - 1. 239 Reviews None in July, however Ms. Jardine is expecting several for August.
 - 2. Updated housing needs assessment- This is part of ED&P's goals for the Strategic Plan from the housing study we did in 2019. Ms. Jardine in gathering data from the Census, Department of Labor, and the Local Realtors Association for this assessment.
 - 3. Hazard Mitigation Plan update- This project is closed out; however Ms. Woodburn reported the following:

a. FEMA approved the plan.

- b. All sixteen municipalities have passed adoption resolutions.
- 5. FEMA DR-4755 (NY Severe Storm and Flooding) Hazard Mitigation Grant Program
 - a. Tioga County Soil and Water and Ms. Jardine are meeting with the Town of Berkshire and Village of Waverly to discuss possible applications and potential projects.
- G. Sustainability Management
 - 1. NYSDEC & Paint Care Program Data collected from the event held June 29th :
 - a. Collected 31,555 lbs. of latex/acrylic and 4,720 lbs. of oil-based paint
 - b. 90% of the latex/acrylic paint will be recycled
 - c. GreenSheen was happy with this event and is interested in holding another event in 2025
 - 2. NYSERDA/Tioga County Fleet Inventory

- Tilmor non-profit grant obtained for a walk-behind cultivator, offering better weed control at HCF
- Incubator Farmers continue to sell crops and cut flowers at regional farmers markets: Ithaca, Freeville, Candor and Wednesday Market/Food Pantry and CSA shares.
- One farmer has diversified cut flower business into garden consultancy, focusing on native plants

WIOA Youth Employment Program/Workforce: Joint Program spotlight with Dept of Labor for VR experience at Tioga County Fair. Connecting Tioga employers with Career Center and sharing Job openings. Work Experience (5 youth in program) Outcomes: 2 completed program and entered college, 1 completed and was hired by the company and 2 continue their programs at Open Door Mission and Tioga County Career Center.

Success Stories: 2 individuals earned GEDs in August, 1 youth enlisted in the Marines and has entered Basic Training; 4 youth assisted with driving/5 hour course; 7 individuals were assisted with college applications and are now attending TC3, SUNY Broome, Belvadere, SUNY Morrisville and Corning Community College.

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SWCD REPORT August 2024

AGRICULTURE PROGRAM:

- The District has several Ag Nonpoint Source Pollution Control grant contracts that are active and we are finishing this construction season. We have 5 farms completing riparian area plantings to complete their stream corridor projects, 2 farms involved in a cover cropping grant that will close out after fall implementation. We also secured Climate Resilient Farming (CRF) grants and currently have two contracts on 2 separate farms that are also underway. One of the farms with CRF funding competed their project this spring and we are working on the closeout.
- Grant Applications SWCD submitted an application to the CRF RD 8, we are awaiting announcements on the grants. Ag Nonpoint Source Pollution Control grant application will likely be out in the fall/winter timeframe and we are planning to submit 2 applications towards that RFP.
- We are currently planning several farms to have them ready for future rounds of competitive grant funding.
- We secured funding and are working with Tioga CCE, Cass Hill Road property, where we will construct two stormwater ponds at their facility this summer that will hold back a 100 year storm event providing flood mitigation to the downstream watershed, in addition we will be creating a wetland complex and planting 12 acres of riparian forest buffer. Construction was planned for this year but due to wet year we have had likely push construction to 2025.
- We are currently working on our Agricultural Environmental Management Program, this program provides funding to provide technical assistance to farms for planning and design conservation practices. We also secured \$200,000 in implementation funding with this program that we plan to work on 4 Best Management implementation projects and support 7 farms with buffer establishment over the next 2 years.
- Our no-till drills and post pounder have been out and are being moved around to interested farms.
 These are available to rent thru the District by contacting Alex Marks.
- Our Buffer Steward Monitoring and Maintenance program evaluated 137 acres of buffer, checked 16,776 stems. Approximately 10 sites out of the 47 monitored were under 60% survival. We will be working on a plan for those sites over the coming months. Overall, we had 72% survival for trees and 73% shrub survival, goal for buffer establishment is 70%.

DEAN CREEK DAM REHABILITATION PROCESS:

- Town of Spencer as one of the project sponsors has not signed the completed watershed rehabilitation plan. Funding for the design of the dam rehabilitation is contingent on all 3 sponsors signing the plan. The District and Tioga County Legislature have all passed resolutions and signed the plan.
- District staff are working on updating the dams Emergency Action Plan (EAP). It has been reviewed and approved by NRCS, next steps are to submit to NYSDEC for review.

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HAZARD MITIGATION:

- All municipalities adopted the plan, next steps are to complete grant close out.
- Assisting Town of Richford with culvert installation on Tubbs Hill Rd, SWCD staff completed design and conducting construction oversight.
- Assisting Town of Newark Valley with property purchase and demolition.
- HMGP funding is available now, notified municipalities and offered assistance to help with application. Town of Berkshire has requested our assistance with a bridge that has been flagged by NYSDOT. We will submit an application for the Town to have an engineering design completed. Elaine Jardine is also assisting with the application.

STORMWATER:

We continue to review Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans for the Town of Owego, many of these are for solar projects but also commercial development in the town. We just completed review for the Farmer Brown Solar Project and currently reviewing Tractor Supply.

STREAM PROGRAM:

- We continue to provide permit and design assistance to Landowner's and municipalities when it comes to stream work. We currently have 2 active stream project that we are doing construction oversight on in the Owego Creek Watershed. Currently assisting 4 municipalities with stream issues, assessments and permitting for projects.
- We have an active grant with FEMA on Owego Creek where we are purchasing a home, plan to demolish and then stabilize a steep eroding bank.
- We also secured grant funding for the County IDA to complete a project on Owego Creek where streambank erosion is jeopardizing the railroad and utility line. We just received information form the state to submit work plan and budget to move the contract forward, so our plan is to complete the project next summer (2025).
- We submitted a WQIP application for a stream restoration project on W. Branch Owego Creek.

Education and Outreach:

- We held our second pasture walk in August focused on beef cows. We are collaborating with the USC, SCDFC and CCE. There will be one more pasture walk held in September.
- Sundaes at the Farm was a success at Frisbie Bros Dairy, we estimate 940 attendees.
- SWCD staff participated in the Tioga County Fair, giving away cheese and yogurt and engaging with individuals regarding our programming and assistance that is available.

WHEREAS: This downtown plan project budget is \$45,000 as determined by conducting a Request for Proposals to various consultants; and

WHEREAS: If awarded and upon completion, the intention of the Village of Newark Valley Downtown Economic Strategic Plan is to proceed to an ESD New York Forward grant application in the future; and

WHEREAS: ESD requires a 50% cash match for Planning & Feasibility Studies grant program and Tioga County Economic Development would like to contribute a small amount of cash to the proposed project budget in partnership with the Village of Newark Valley, who will commit the remaining of the 50% match in cash; and

WHEREAS: In 2025, Economic Development anticipates having \$5,000 available in the budget line item of A6422.540590 Services Rendered to commit as Tioga County's cash match to said grant application; therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Legislature hereby authorizes earmarking a total cash match commitment of \$5,000 from the 2024 Economic Development budget as specified; and be it further

RESOLVED: That if the Village of Newark Valley is awarded the grant request from NYS Empire State Development in late fall of 2024 these funds be carried forward to the specified account in 2025.
