#### FINANCIAL:

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#### Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report May 7, 2024

## **Budget Status:**

2024 Revenue Budget:

- \$810 of DWI Supervision fee collected in April. \$3,480 collected in 2024
- \$2,395 in restitution and surcharge collected in April. \$10,106.24 collected to date in 2024

## Current Business:

- Staffing A Probation Officer resigned effective May 2, 2024. Therefore, there are two open Probation Officer I positions that remain unfilled. There have been multiple interviews with candidates for the positions, however the Civil Service exam will not be given until June with results from the exam expected in the Fall.
- Training Probation Officers continue to attend trainings throughout the state while working toward fulfilling their yearly minimum training requirement of 21 hours. To date, Officers have attended trainings in regard to Pre-Trial Release, DWI Supervision, Officer Wellness, Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression (SOGIE), and Decision Points.

From May 21-23, 2024, all Probation Officers will be attending a three-day training at the Tioga County Sheriff's Office being organized by the Tioga County Threat Assessment Management (TAM) Team and the Domestic Terrorism Prevention Unit. Probation Officers will complete the Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (TERC) in anticipation of their participation on the Tioga County Threat Advisory Committee in the future.

- 3. All Probation access doors have now been rewired to enable Probation staff to access the Department without using a physical key. Probation staff can now use their County ID card or wristbands provided by IT to access the Department. In addition to paying for the last door upgrade, IT also provided the funding for the update and installation of a security camera and control pad which allows Probation Staff to view who is at the rear entry door and allow them access remotely through the new control panel.
- 4. Probation staff and their families teamed up with Tioga County Court Staff and their families to participate in the Tioga County Spring Clean-Up Day on April 13, 2024, organized by Sister Mary O'Brien of Tioga County Rural Ministries. This is the second year that Probation staff and Court staff worked together to help elderly citizens of Tioga County with Spring clean-up at their homes.
- 5. Probation would like to begin discussions with the Committee regarding the possibility of requesting an increase of all Probation series positions in the salary schedule by one

pay grade. The Probation Director plans to bring the committee details regarding the proposal at the June Public Safety Meeting.

## 6. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

April of 2024- There were two Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDAT) received for the month of April. A 13-year-old female was issued a JDAT for Petit Larceny after she allegedly made unauthorized purchases using her grandmother's credit card. There was also a 16-year-old male issued a JDAT for Criminal Mischief and Endangering the Welfare of a Child (both misdemeanors) after he allegedly threw a ball on the school bus and damaged some equipment on the bus. One of the youth was referred to the County Attorney's Office due to having needs which could not be met during a diversion period. The other youth appeared appropriate for Diversion and was scheduled to sign a Diversion contract.

YTD: 7 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, -- Seven (7) youth have been screened in 2024. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, five (5) youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Zero (0) youth were found to be level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. Two (2) youth were found to be level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Zero (0) youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There is one youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

## ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There is currently one individual being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP has resumed with a new Officer at the TCSO supervising the program following the retirement of Corrections Officer Roy Schreiner. At times the program will only function on one day of the weekend if numbers drop too low. WWP is also being used as a graduated sanction on Probation Violations.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 24 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

**Court Ordered Investigations:** 45 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

**Supervision**: 182 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 12 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
