Tioga Department of Mental Hygiene Annual Report 2022

Tioga County Mental Hygiene continues to offer a comprehensive continuum of care for citizens of Tioga County who have needs related to Mental Health, Substance Misuse, and/or Developmental Disabilities. The Department provided nearly 17,500 services to Tioga County residents in 2022. We have seen an increase in requests for services by consumers not previously known to the department. We continue to have the ability to provide tele-health to residents, which increases access to care. The department provides quality and timely care thanks to a tireless, dedicated and a resilient workforce, despite workforce shortages.

The Community Services Board continues to review and approve policies for the department as well as participate in planning. NYS requires the Director of Community Services to submit each year (New York State Mental Hygiene Law \$ 41.16). The plan outlines goals and objectives for the county as a guide to and facilitation of local service planning. The plan is developed with stakeholders in the county, many of whom are on our three Subcommittees.

The Director of Community Services is charged with oversight, planning and passing through funding to providers in Tioga County that are part of a continuum of care. Please see the list of providers below that the department provides state aid, apart from Developmental Disabilities which is provided directly from the state.

- The Department had very successful audits by both Office of Mental Health (OMH) and Office Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS). We were able to obtain maximum licensure of 3 years as a result.
- The Department Head supported OMH /NYS DEPT ED grant that allowed for the expansion of school-based services at Spencer VanEtten and Tioga Center.
- Received increased State Aid to develop and contract for Medicated Assisted Treatment Program in the Tioga County Jail.
- The Department was able to provide OMH/OASAS Workforce Bonus for all employees of Mental Hygiene with the support of the Legislature and CSEA.
- The Director provided all support needed by NYS OMH to approve a state-of-the-art eating disorder clinic for adolescents'/teens in Tioga County. The Healing and Health Retreat (HeaHea).
- Began providing Sublocade in our outpatient treatment program.
- Joseph P. Dwyer Grant \$100,000 OMH was passed through to our County Veterans Department.
- Offer free Narcan Kits and Training to anyone who requests.
- We are very proud of our two coalitions that provide a valuable service to Tioga County. Tioga County Advocacy, Support and Prevention Coalition (Tioga ASAP) and Tioga County Suicide Prevention Coalition. Both coalitions bring new interest, awareness, trainings, ideas and support to the community through hosted and planned community events as well as media campaigns.
