### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- Radio Project Sent out environmental questionnaires to be completed. The Sheriff's Office has received all their new portable radios. They are programmed and being deployed out. We are expecting a second batch of radios that will be programmed and deployed to Waverly and Owego Police Departments. These radios should increase the communication currently and can be reprogrammed to work on the new system.
- CAD Project Info Tech (IT) has been working to correct the issue with the mapping feature in the NYSP cars with no success. This feature still remains inactive, which prevents dispatch from seeing their location. Legislator Standinger stated that Jeremy Loveland (from IT) has a connection with someone in IT at the state level that can help with this situation.
- EMS no significant changes in county EMS coverage. The same issues continue to exist regarding manpower shortages. Spring EMT classes are starting, there was a TBI (Traumatic Brain Injury) class held at Public Safety on January 25<sup>th</sup> that was well attended. The Governer's State of the State included Information on analys to EMS including working to make it an essential service. There were many updates on training, dispatch, and coverage within the county.
- Emergency Management No significant updates at this time.
- FIRE The year is already off to a busy start with multiple fires

# NEW BUSINESS

- Staffing One open Probation Officer I position remains unfilled. Still looking no interest.
- Training Two Probation Officers successfully completed their Basic Course for Peace Officer Academy on January 26, 2024. The academy includes the officers getting sprayed with pepper spray and completing a week of hands-on defensive tactics. Alfred State University will be having one in May 2024 that would be more towards what Probation Officer would handle this day in age. The Probation Officer would stay on campus, and we'd only pay \$50/week for lodging.
- In December of 2023, Probation received a Reward Notice from the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) indicating Probation was awarded \$60,000 to spend

towards the cost of providing Pre-Trial Services in Tioga County. Info Tech Director Jeremy Loveland is in the process of ordering iPads for each officer as well as administrators and one to be shared by clerical staff.

- Individuals under supervision for sex offense have begun enrolling in the newly mandated technology monitoring system provided by IPPC Technologies. County Attorney DeWind stated that Assistant District Attorney Mancini did a nice job researching after one attorney stated that it's the constitutional right of the probationer.
- Quality Assurance (audit program). Admin Staff at Probation have developed a rough draft of the Quality Assurance Program which will be put into place by June of 2024.
- Two Probation Officers and one Probation Assistant has been assigned to complete the Pre-Sentence Investigation regarding the assonist with Tioga Downs.
- Juvenile Delinquency Services No JD Appearance Tickets were issued in January. Will receive one this month from students fighting.
- ATI Programs Electronic Monitoring three (3) individuals being monitored via Alco Tag and GPS electronic monitoring system. Pre-Trial Release (PTR) – 20 people being supervised via the PTR.
- Court Ordered Investigations 55 active; Supervision 180 cases; and Violation of Probation petitions – 14 defendants/respondents.

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### Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report March 5, 2024

# **Budget Status:**

2024 Revenue Budget:

- \$940 of DWI Supervision fee collected in February. \$1,900 collected in 2024
- \$2,361.99 in restitution and surcharge collected in February. \$4,946.99 collected to date in 2024

# Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer I position remains unfilled. One application has been received and an interview is in the process of being scheduled.
- Training The most recently hired Probation Officer, Patrick Van Durme has been scheduled to attend Fundamentals of Probation Practice (FPP) and Basic Course for Peace Officer (BCPO) training in the Spring. He is scheduled to attend FPP in Rochester from March 22 to April 19. Pat will attend BCPO at Alfred University from May 14, 2024 to June 28, 2024.
- 3. In December of 2023, Probation received a Reward Notice from the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) indicating Probation was awarded \$60,000 to spend toward the cost of providing Pre-Trial Services in Tioga County. Tioga County received the money in January. IT Director Loveland is in the process of ordering Ipads for each officer in the department as well as administrators and one to be shared by secretarial staff who attend court appearances with Supervisors and take notes. In addition, money has been designated for use of enhanced electronic monitoring systems, five years of payment for the internet service required for the Ipads, and gasoline for the vehicles used to attend court.

Update: Ipads, keyboards, and pens have been ordered by Director Loveland.

- 4. Probation continues to try to assist the Sheriff's Office with transports when possible. A Probation Officer recently accompanied a Sheriff's Deputy to Tennessee to bring back a probation absconder who was picked up. Probation was just notified of another absconder who will need to be extradited from Central Pennsylvania in the near future.
- 5. Quality Assurance (audit program). Admin Staff at Probation have developed a rough draft of the Quality Assurance Program which will be put into place by June of 2024. Admin staff have reviewed multiple plans from various Probation Departments around the state and created a program which should work well in Tioga County. Admin staff will continue to refine the program during the coming months.

**Update**: A trial audit was performed which have already resulted in some policy changes within the Department. It appears the formal audit process will be beneficial in improving efficiency and effectiveness throughout the Department.

- 6. Two Probation Officers and one Probation Assistant has been assigned to complete the Pre-Sentence Investigation regarding the arson at the Tioga Downs horse barns. More individuals have been released on Pre-Trial Release in regard to the on-going Tompkins County kidnapping/murder case and we anticipate another extensive investigation in regard to the recent murder arrest from the alleged domestic violence murder in Apalachin. These cases in addition to the more than dozen justice courts sending us investigation orders have all officers very busy.
- 7. Tioga County Spring Clean-Up Day organized by Sister Mary O'Brien of Tioga County Rural Ministries will be Saturday, April 13, 2024. Last year Probation and Court personnel teamed up to participate in the clean up day with fantastic results. Probation intends to try to organize another team effort this year.

# 8. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

February of 2024- There were two Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Ticket (JDAT) received for the month of February. The two respondents were both charged with Assault in the Third Degree and Menacing in the Third Degree, Misdemeanors after attacking another student at school. Due to the issue of physical violence in the school setting, the matters were referred to the County Attorney's Office for petition to Family Court.

YTD: 2 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, -- Two youth have been screened in 2024. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, Two youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Zero youth were found to be a level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. Zero youth were found to be a level a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Zero youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There is one youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

# ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently two individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP will be cancelled for the second week due to a lag in orders sentencing defendants to perform community service. Probation has addressed this issue with the District Attorney's Office and the Courts. It is anticipated this will be a short-lived hiatus. WWP is also being used as a graduated sanction on Probation Violations.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 21 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

**Court Ordered Investigations:** 51 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

**Supervision**: 175 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

**Violation of Probation petitions**: 9 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.

RESOLUTION NO. -24 RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TIOGA COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT AND CATALIS COURTS & LAND RECORDS, LLC f/k/a AUTOMON LLC TO PROVIDE SOFTWARE AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CASELOAD EXPLORER PRODUCT

WHEREAS: The Tioga County Legislature has approved contracts between Tioga County Probation Department and Catalis Court & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC since 2008; and

WHEREAS: Catalis Court & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC has changed their contract status with New York State, therefore the Tioga County Legislature is approving that the Probation Department can contract with Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC as a sole source provider of Caseload Explorer, a software program that meets the qualifications of 9 NYCRR 345, which mandates Probation Departments to use a software program that automatically sends Presentence Investigation completed in the software program to the DCJS PSI Repository in Albany, NY. Caseload Explorer software is the only software in New York State that meets this criteria; and

WHEREAS: Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon, LLC has summited their yearly Maintenance Agreement to Tioga County Probation which consists of the base charge of \$5,298.34, plus a fee of \$259.47 per user. Probation has 17 registered users of the software, so the total cost for basic software maintenance for contract period of 3/25/2024 to 3/24/2025 is \$9,709.33; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Probation Director is approved to contract with Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon, LLC as a sole source provider for software and maintenance costs in 2024 for Caseload Explorer and Ce Assessments in the amount of \$9,709.33.
