- Buddi, NY LLC Contract proposed contract was received for electronic monitoring. Once the County Attorney has reviewed and approved it, a resolution will be presented to the Committee.
- Community Engrgement attended Field of the Fallen with Veterans. Staff has been great on volunteering.
- Quality Assurance Program -- working with IT to create a computer-based system to randomly select cases to be audited on a monthly basis.
- Succession Planning Fred Kiechle will be promoted to Probation Supervisor, replacing Terri Rosenberger, who will be retiring at the end of this month.
- Juvenile Delinquency Services- One (1) appearance ticket for the month of August. YTD 9 JDATs received to date.

Release – thirteen (13) people are being supervised via Pre-Trial Release Program. Court ordered investigations – 37 active investigations. Supervision – 192 cases – Violation of Probation – 21 defendants/respondents have violation petitions against them.

Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report October 3, 2023

Budget Status:

2023 Revenue Budget:

- \$600 of DWI Supervision fee collected in September. \$6,625 collected to date in 2023
- \$5,067.10 in restitution and surcharge collected in September. \$15,941.15 collected to date in 2023

Current Business:

- 1. Budget The Probation budget is on track for 2023. Seventy percent of our budget has been expended and we are 75% through the fiscal year.
- 2. Probation Department The entry doors at Probation have been upgraded with new card entry devices. There is one door that never had card entry and discussions are being had with IT to determine if that door can be converted to card entry as well.
- 3. Probation received a proposed contract from Buddi US, LLC to provide comprehensive monitoring services for Probation. The services include traditional GPS electronic monitoring, GPS monitoring through a phone application, and real time alcohol monitoring through a transdermal monitoring system. The contract also includes insurance on the devices which will eliminate the threat of a budgetary hardship should multiple offenders destroy, lose, or otherwise damage the devices. The proposed contract has been forwarded to the County Attorney's Office for review. Upon its approval by the County Attorney, Probation will bring forth a resolution to enter into said contract. Entering into the contract will not increase the current Probation budget.

Update: Still awaiting County Attorney approval. A Resolution to enter into contract with Buddi will be brought forward after approval.

- 4. Community engagement Probation staff attended the Family Day at the Nichols Reserve Center which was organized due to the reservists being deployed in the near future. Probation also volunteered at the Veteran's Grocery Giveaway held at the Park Terrace United Methodist Church on September 29, 2023.
- 5. Probation has initiated the creation of a Quality Assurance Program within the Department in line with the best practices being recommended by the Department of Criminal Justice Services. The Administrative Team within the Department has begun the review of existing case audit forms and policies currently utilized by other county Probation Departments. The forms and policy will be modified to fit the framework of the Tioga County Probation Department. Probation also plans to enlist the assistance of the Tioga County IT Department in order to create a computer-based system to randomly select cases to be audited on a monthly basis. Target date for implementation of the Quality Assurance Policy is January of 2025.

Update: Ticket has been submitted to IT and discussions had with IT Director Loveland regarding this initiative. Awaiting word from IT as to when this may be accomplished.

6. Staff - Teri Rosenberger retired from her position of Probation Supervisor effective September 29, 2023. Fred Kiechle was promoted to that position effective October 2, 2023. This now means there is one open Sr. Probation Officer position and one open Probation Officer position.

Two candidates have been interviewed for the open Probation Officer position. If one is chosen, they will be hired provisionally pending the next Probation Officer Civil Service Exam.

7. Training – Probation received confirmation that the two Probation Officers who need to complete five weeks of Basic Course for Peace Officer (BCPO) training will be able to attend the class offered in Binghamton in December and January.

8. Juvenile Delinguency Services:

September of 2023- There were two Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Ticket (JDAT) received for the month of September. The JDATs alleged the respondents committed acts which if committed by an adult would constitute the crime of Burglary in the Third Degree.

YTD: 11 JDATs received to date.

• E- Connect: To date, six youth have been screened in 2023. As a result of the E-Connect screening, two youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Three youth were found to be a level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. One youth was found to be a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH.

***The JDATs received in September were not scheduled to appear at Probation until October 3, 2023. Therefore, their results on the E-Connect screening are not included in this report.

• There are no youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There is currently one individual being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app GPS electronic monitoring system and one defendant with the traditional ankle monitor.
- <u>Community Service</u> Weekend Work Program continues with crews being scheduled every weekend.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 11 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release Program

Court Ordered Investigations: 36 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 190 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 17 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE STSJP CONTRACT FOR SFY 2023-2024 PROBATION AS LEAD AGENCY FOR APPLICATION FOR FUNDING VIA STSJP

WHEREAS: The NYS Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) has directed every County to create Alternative to Detention programing and since 2015 the Probation Department has been the Lead Agency for the County to apply for STSJP funding; and

WHEREAS: The funding is based on an approved OCFS contract for a maximum of \$40,000 and is set at a ratio of 62% state reimbursement – 38% county share for monies expended by the County for Alternative to Detention programing for Juvenile Delinquents. The Tioga County Legislature agrees to accept this reimbursement funding format; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Legislative Chair is approved to contract with the Office of Children and Family Services for STSJP funding as follows:
