### **OFFICE of EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT – Mike Simmons:**

### FINANCIAL:

• Budget is on track.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- Communications Project Report:
  - Radio Project: Chair Sauerbrey, Director Simmons, Kevin Karn of NYSTEC and Chris Meyer from Motorola met on March 30, 2022, little information has been received as to when Grant will be announced; Grants have been stalled due to understaffing.
- CAD Project:
  - o Scheduled to go live in May 2022.
  - Working on fire department response plan.
  - o Data Transfer: Cost is being established and will be asked for next month, this is an additional cost which is pertinent to keep the records from the old system.
  - Training has been ongoing.



- EMS Study:
  - o Completed report should be received within the next few weeks.
- Emergency Management:
  - Deputy Director Williams and Director Simmons are working on developing local Emergency plans between Towns and Villages.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Tompkins County Mass Notification System:
  - They have been using SIREN (Safety & Incident Real-Time Emergency Notifications) similar to CODE RED, that the Village of Owego uses and NY Alert, that we currently use; cost is around \$12,000 annually.

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### Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report May 3, 2022

## **Budget Status:**

2022 Revenue Budget:

- \$360 of DWI Supervision fee collected in April. \$3,220 collected to date in 2022
- \$675 in restitution and surcharge collected in April. \$192,706 collected to date in 2022

2022 Budget: On target

# Current Business:

- Staffing Porshea Moore withdrew her acceptance of the Accounting Associate III
  position and therefore the search continues for an acceptable candidate. There are
  two more interviews scheduled at this time. Probation Assistant Lisa Baker and
  Secretary to the Director Kristen Kallin continue to complete the Accounting Associate
  III duties while the position is vacant. It is for this reason that this Director would like to
  continue to explore some sort of additional monetary compensation for Lisa and
  Kristen.
- 2. New Probation Officer training requirements The Council of Probation Administrators (COPA) is engaged in discussions with members of the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to address the issue of new training mandates and the lack of availability to have new probation officers trained in a timely manner. Although DCJS was able to secure a waiver of the new training requirements until January 1, 2023, it is becoming clear to Probation Directors throughout the state that given the number of new probation officers who need to be trained, completing training by January 1, 2023 may not be possible.
- 3. Probation training of law enforcement in collaboration with other County Agencies -On April 27, 2022, Probation in conjunction with Veteran's Services, Department of Social Services, Safe Harbor, and the Tioga County Advocacy Support and Prevention (ASAP) Coalition started a series of trainings with Tioga County law enforcement agencies. The objective of the training is to become familiar with the members of each agency and discuss new developments in each other's discipline. After two trainings with the Village of Owego Police Department, arrangements will be made to meet with the New York State Police, Tioga County Sheriff's Office, and the Village of Waverly Police Department.
- 4. Decision points On April 20, 2022, this Director and Probation Supervisor Chad Post met with the administration of the Newark Valley High School in order to discuss taking the Decision Points curriculum to their High School. It was agreed that Probation Staff would provide the Decision Points training at the Newark Valley High School in the month of May and would be continued throughout the 2022-2023 school year.

5. Tioga County was recently awarded a \$10,000 grant through the Regional Youth Justice Team. Director of Services Liz Myers (TCDSS) applied for the grant in order to work in conjunction with Tioga County Probation to continue our Results Based Leadership approach to Juvenile Justice issues in Tioga County. The money will also be used for joint trainings of TCDSS and Probation staff in the area of criminogenic risk factors present in the youth involved in either system.

**Update:** Discussions are in progress to partner with New Justice Conflict Resolution Services Inc. out of Syracuse, NY to provide trainings for both DSS and Probation staff. The trainings being discussed are Introduction to Restorative Justice Practices and Trauma Informed Training.

6. Statewide financial work group – Three members of the Tioga County Probation Department (Director Brian Cain, Part time Supervisor Joy Bennett, and Probation Assistant Lisa Baker) are currently working with a statewide collaborative effort to clarify and/or improve the collection and distribution of restitution ordered by the Courts throughout New York State.

**Update**: Meetings of the State wide financial work group have continued. The work groups have started meeting with other state agencies to develop forms and processes which will satisfy the needs of all parties.

# 7. Juvenile Delinguency Services:

April of 2022- Probation received no JD tickets for the month of April.

YTD: 13 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: 11 of 13 eligible youth screened (two respondents did not appear). Eight of the youth screened were determined to be below threshold for mental health services. Three youth were determined to be a level III and were referred for a mental health assessment.
- Probation continues to support and make referrals to ACBC as their Making Our Success Sustainable (M.O.S.S.) Program continues to grow. The program has moved to a new location on North Avenue in Owego. It appears the move to the North Avenue location has been beneficial for the program.
- We have four youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

# ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> two adult offenders and one juvenile are currently being monitored using the traditional electronic monitoring unit.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP is paused until June 1, 2022 to allow for the sentencing of more individuals to the WWP program.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are ten people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

**Court Ordered Investigations:** 33 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

**Supervision**: 186 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 18 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Legislature approves the Alternatives to Incarceration Service Plan for the time period of 7/1/2022 to 6/30/2023 and submit same to the NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services and Office of Probation and Correctional Alternatives to continue state-grant funding for Pre-Trial Release, Community Service, and Specialized Treatment

RESOLUTION NO. -22 AUTHORIZE MIGRATION TO HOSTED PLATFORM FOR AUTOMON PROBATION SOFTWARE

WHEREAS: AutoMon provides case and data management solutions to City, County, and State Probation, Pretrial, Specialty Court and Corrections agencies throughout North America; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County currently hosts its Probation Case Management software, AutoMon, on internal Information Technology infrastructure; and

WHEREAS: That internal Information Technology infrastructure has reached end of life, requiring extensive upgrades and maintenance; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Chair of the Legislature is authorized, on behalf of Tioga County, New York, to enter into a Master Subscription Agreement with AutoMon, LLC to host its probation system and migrate data to AutoMon's Information Technology infrastructure; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a prorated fee of \$3,910.00 shall be paid to AutoMon, LLC for hosting services beginning June 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.
