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Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report May 6, 2025

Budget Status:

2025 Revenue Budget:

- \$1,045 of DWI Supervision fee collected in April. \$3,305 collected in 2025
- \$1,822 in restitution and surcharge collected in April. \$5,384.39 collected in 2025

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer position remains unfilled.
- 2. Training Staff attended Atlas Onboarding training in April. Tioga Probation staff also provided training for two other probation departments during the month. Assistance in completing the Domestic Violence Risk Assessment as well as Financial Training as it pertains to Caseload Explorer were provided to other counties. The Tioga County Sheriff's Office has agreed to provide a firearms recognition and safety training for Probation Officers. This training will be offered to other County Probation Departments as many Probation Directors have expressed an interest in having their officers attend.
- 3. Atlas Digital Platform Probation brought forth a resolution which was adopted by the Legislature which allows Probation to enter into a three-year contract with The Change Company to access their Evidence Based digital programs for use with both the Adult and Juvenile populations in Tioga County. The aggregate cost of the contract is slightly more than \$12,000 and will be funded with Pretrial Release Award money as well as Floyd Hooker Foundation money. Probation intends to include a percentage of the cost of the contract in the 2025-2026 Raise the Age Plan which would reimburse Tioga County 100% for the RTA juveniles who utilize the modules.

Update: Probation Officers are beginning to use the Atlas platform with their probationers.

- 4. Probation is exploring having one of our Officers certified as a court certified translator for Spanish and French. Probation is currently conducting a Pre-Sentence Investigation regarding a Spanish speaking defendant. Completing the investigation requires the County using translation services as the Probation Officer is not "certified" although he is fluent in both languages.
- 5. Probation staff volunteered at the Drug Take Back event in April. The Probation Community Outreach Committee is preparing for fall events such as the return to school backpack giveaway in the Fall.
- 6. In the past month, Probation has received Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets regarding youth who are alleged to have set fires in Tioga County. In exploring referral resources for the youth, it became apparent this was an area that required more attention. After speaking to numerous professionals, Probation purchased the Firesetting Risk Assessment Tool for Youth (FRAT-Y) to determine risk level for youth exhibiting these behaviors. Probation is currently seeking a mental health partner to complete the assessment.
- 7. On April 23, 2025, Probation held a meeting with representatives from other County Departments (Tioga County Sheriff's Office, Personnel, County Attorney, Safety Officers, County Administrator, CSEA Union President) to discuss the issues that would need be addressed for Probation to become a partially armed Department. Currently, 74% of

Probation Departments in New York State are armed Departments. Probation hopes to have a proposal to present to the Public Safety Committee some time in 2026 regarding this issue.

8. Due to the continued low number of Court Orders for community service on the Weekend Work Program, Probation met with the District Attorney's Office to discuss the issue. It was agreed that moving forward, in all cases where the defendant is physically able, completion of community service on the WWP will be a part of the plea agreement as follows;

> Class E Felony Class D Felony Class C Felony and above

96 hours of community service on WWP 144 hours of community service on WWP 256 hours of community service on WWP

9. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

April of 2025- There were five (5) Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDATs) received for the month of April. The JDATs alleged the respondents committed acts which if committed by an adult would constitute the crimes of Arson, Burglary, Criminal Mischief, Assault, Harassment, and Criminal Trespass.

YTD: 12 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, eleven (11) youth have been screened in 2025. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, six (6) youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Four (4) youth were found to be a level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. One (1) youth was found to be a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Zero (0) youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There are currently two youth participating in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently seven (9) individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP is scheduled to resume this month. Participants will complete projects as scheduled by the TCSO.
- Pre-Trial Release There are 32 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 52 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 175 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 7 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
