2020 HIGHLIGHTS

2020 started off as a normal year. But, as we all know, it didn't stay normal for long. As the Covid-19 pandemic spread to the United States, office procedures had to change rapidly to ensure the safety of our customers and employees. I am very proud to say that the staff in the Clerk's Office and in the DMV went above and beyond the call of duty to adapt and continued to provide excellent and safe customer service to the constituents of Tioga County.

On March 18, 2020, per State mandate, County offices closed to the public. At that time, the Clerk's Office staff split into two crews so that staff could safely work on land recordings and court filings that came in through the mail, by electronic means, or through a drop box that was placed in the lobby of 16 Court Street. The DMV was shut down completely on order of the NYS Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, with no staff being allowed to report to the office.

Early in April, DMV offices were allowed to be staffed at 50%. The drop box at 16 Court Street was then opened up to also allow for DMV transactions. The DMV staff also split into two crews so that dealer work, mail, and drop box transactions could be processed.

The full staff of the Clerk's Office returned to work together on May 18th. The public was still unable to come into the office so the drop box was continued. Fortunately, the Clerk's Office had already established electronic recording and filing for land records and court documents.

As of June 1st the drop box for DMV transactions had become so popular that it had to be moved to the hallway outside the DMV office at 56 Main Street. The Clerk and Deputy Clerk manned the drop box in the hall until early in July when Motor Vehicles offices were finally able to open to the public.

The Clerk's Office was also able to reopen to the public in early July. The Recording Clerks all followed procedures that kept customers socially distanced and common surfaces sanitized. The DMV office, with the invaluable aid of the IT Department, put an appointment system into place that controlled customer flow to ensure everyone's safety.

Despite the pandemic, compared to 2019, the Clerk's Office revenue was actually up by 2.04%. This can be attributed, at least in part, to the drop in interest rates that caused more people to refinance, buy a new home, or take out a home equity line of credit.

Unfortunately, the DMV did not fare so well. The County's 12.7% take on all transactions and sales tax retention was down by 16% when compared to 2019. Tioga County Auto Use Fees, which we collect whenever a resident of the county registers a vehicle, were down by 5.8%. I believe that the drop box helped to mitigate this impact.

Overall, I am so proud of the employees of the Clerk's Office and the Motor Vehicles Department and very grateful for how all offices came together to help each other adjust to this horrible pandemic. I cannot wait to see how we all help Tioga County rebound!
