MEETING MINUTES October 17, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: at 7:30 a.m. by Dr. Hills.

PRESENTATION: Mr. McCann gave a fiscal update for Tioga County Public Health (handouts were distributed). Discussed current numbers seen through August, sources of revenue including but not limited to Preschool Transportation Program and State Aid and summarized the 2025 proposed budget. Legislator Standinger noted that Mr. McCann works very closely with the County Administrator, who speaks very highly of Mr. McCann's transparency. Mr. McCann stated that it is a team approach for every budget. Ms. Vroman agreed and added that Mr. McCann values the department's accountability. Additional discussion of County vehicles, State Aid increase due to appropriate running of programs and filling vacant positions, State Aid eligible programs and activities, and rabies post exposure treatment costs.

- Dr. Raftis inquired if there are any fiscal concerns for the future. Ms. Vroman stated that the department is in a good position with expenses and revenue. The only unknown is the Preschool Program, but the program has been steady post COVID (additional discussion of the Preschool and Early Intervention Programs). Mr. McCann added that there has been discussion of school districts taking over Preschool transportation in the future, which will be a benefit to Public Health expenses.
- Dr. Hills noted that it looks like Public Health programs have improved. Mr. McCann stated that program improvement can be attributed to Ms. Vroman's leadership.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Meeting Minutes (September): Correction of minutes to reflect that Dr. Hills made the true nomination for Dr. Raftis to be included on the Slate of Officers instead of Ms. Leary; motion to approve prior minutes with noted correction made by Mr. Simmons; seconded by Ms. Leary, all were in favor, none opposed, motion approved.
- Enforcements: Brief discussion of water violation for Links At Hiawatha Landing.
- Tioga Casting Property: Ms. Vroman provided update. After last meeting, the Board of Health Order was issued September 24, 2024. That morning, Ms. Vroman, Public Health Sanitarians, law enforcement, Village Code Enforcement, a local pastor, Catholic Charities, Mental Hygiene and Department of Social Services representatives went to the property and distributed the Order to anyone at the property and stapled placards and Orders to vacant shelters; posting about 200 placards. Seven individuals either accepted temporary housing or rehabilitation. Two to three



individuals have been arrested. Anyone still onsite 24 hours after issuing the Order were issued tickets. The County has put up a bid for the clean up of the property. Had an Administrative Hearing on October 8, 2024, as an opportunity for the owner on record and people living at the property to be heard; no respondents showed. Hearing Officer was from Cayuga County, retiree from the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) with experience in remediation. Off record he provided recommendations. Hearing Officer sent a draft of Hearing Decision. Hearing Officer during the hearing had concern for declared owner on record. We sent document that did have the mentioned property owner listed which cleared his concern. In his decision, he stated that the Department of Environmental Conservation is in violation of their own Site Management Plan. The County is justified in recommending the DEC put up a fence around entire property. Will send to County Attorney DeWind when we receive the final signed Hearing Decision. Hoping that he will lead this charge in violation of the DEC. Ms. Vroman distributed the draft decision and pictures of the property. Some discussion of the hearing officer, anticipated clean-up costs, those who accepted temporary accommodations, and the stakeholder relationship in this endeavor. Ms. Leary commended Ms. Vroman's work in this intervention. Ms. Vroman gave her thanks to the Board and staff in this combined effort.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Officer Nominations 2025-2026: At last meeting nominations were made for officers for the next two years (term January 1, 2025- December 31, 2026), Nomination Slate included in Board agenda packet. Both Dr. Hills and Mr. Simmons noted that they would be happy to stay in their current positions. Dr. Hills offered that nominations were still open, could add or delete from the current drafted slate.
 - Dr. Raftis supported the continuation of same officers, Dr. Kapur-Pado advocated for Dr. Nytch. Dr. Hills expressed concern for his own availability, also discussed succession planning (moving Mr. Simmons into presidential role, bringing in new vice president).
 - Nomination slate was amended to remove Dr. Hills and Dr. Raftis from presidential role and removed Dr. Nytch from vice president role.
 - Legislator Standinger motioned to nominate Dr. Nytch for president and Mr. Simmons for vice president; motion seconded by Dr. Kapur-Pado. Dr. Hills called for final vote by raise of hand, a majority were in favor for this motion, none opposed; motion approved.

INFORMATIONAL:

- Staffing Updates: Hired Public Health Technician (son of current Public Health Sanitarian who will be retiring at the New Year), will be focusing on septic work. Have interviewed for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Coordinator position and will likely make an offer. Also received a Public Health Sanitarian application this week, and will be interviewing. Currently hosting two interns from Ithaca College, and at the end of the month will be getting an AmeriCorps worker through Rural Health Network.
 - On hold with accepting new patients on the dental van, Dentist is booked through end of December. Have a part time dentist position that we have been posting, but no luck in receiving applications. Will hopefully have an outcome by next meeting.
- New copies of the amended Sanitary Code have been printed for Board members today. Legislature has approved and has been filed with New York State.
- Have given 28 immunizations this season for children due to be excluded from school.
- Monitoring respiratory cases, already seeing influenza cases.
- Environmental Health and Care Coordination have worked with New York State to close out nine old lead cases in our records.
- Two health educators presented posters at the New York State Rural Health Symposium.
- Our Public Health Nurse became a certified CPR instructor (anticipate utilizing in recertifying Public Health staff and possibly County employees).
- Held ATUPA checks for 37 Tioga County establishments; there were no sales to minors.
- Ongoing tasks:
 - Looking at securing contract with UHS for the Tuberculosis program (to be able to refer patients to UHS for testing/monitoring).



- In 2025 will be continuing with Dr. Zevan as primary medical consultant and Dr. Skiff as a backup.
- Employee Wellness Day is Wednesday October 23 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and will be in the Health and Human Services buildings second floor conference rooms. Encourage Board members to stop in if available.
- Next month is the last meeting for the year, senior management is due to attend, and Ms. Vroman will provide an update on the Strategic Plan. Start thinking about next year's schedule. Please advise if there is anything that we should be focusing on, data that should be tracked/monitored. Feedback is valued.
 - Discussion of this month's tracked data in communicable disease and animal bite investigations.

AGENCY REPORT

September 26- October 23, 2024

<u>Highlights</u>

- We hosted an Employee Wellness Fair for Tioga County employees. There were guided meditations, flu shots, representatives from Mental Hygiene and Employee Assistance Program (EAP), therapy dogs and a food truck! The event went very well and had over 145 participants!
- Todd Kopalek was honored at the County's Employee Recognition Luncheon for his 30 years of service!
- Held our last Rabies Clinic for the year, vaccinating 122 pets. Stray Haven also provided 101 parvo and distemper vaccines.
- Submitted grant application to the Floyd Hooker Foundation to fund a project titled "Tioga County Lead-Free Homes for Children," to support activities aimed at reducing the hazards of lead paint.
- Staff tabled at various events- Candor High School open house, Tioga Opportunities Health Fair at Tioga Downs, Village of Owego Appreciation Event, Apalachin Library's Fall Fest

Health Education

- In partnership with Tioga ASAP Coalition and Tioga County Mental Hygiene participated in Save a Life Day-Free Narcan Day in Tioga County. 104 Opioid Overdose Prevention kits were distributed at Spencer Food Cupboard, The Red Door and Tioga Downs
- Provided Board of Elections with 18 Narcan kits to go in safety bags that are taken to each polling location on election day. Also distributed Deterra Drug Deactivation bags to the Village of Owego office.
- CASA Trinity provided Shawna has a Secret training at the October ASAP Coalition meeting.
- Met with Cortland County Health Department to learn more about their department's Quality Improvement Plan and how they organize quality improvement projects.
- Facilitated activity with children at the Family Resource Center play group to teach about the importance of hand washing. Each family also received a story book call "Lead-Free Me."
- Two Health Educators attended the National Emerging Drug Trends Conference in Dallas, Texas.
- Staff attended New York State Prevention Agenda workgroups, providing input on prevention agenda priorities.

Environmental Health

- Hosted the American Water Works Association (AWWA) meeting, which discussed approaches to corrosion control in public water systems.
- We certified a new water operator for Raymond Hadley Corp.
- EH Director attended meeting with Tioga County Soil and Water for a project to purchase and distribute rain collection barrels as well as the Environmental Health Director's conference in the Adirondacks. This conference discussed Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA), legal issues and new water rules regarding lead and copper.
- Public Health Sanitarians attended various trainings including radon training in Broome County and a training held in Oswego on conducting sanitary surveys for small, non-community water supplies.
 Patient Services (EL Dental Clinic)

Patient Services (El, Dental, Clinic)

- The Early Intervention (EI) team has been navigating the transition to the new EI Hub. This new system has presented challenges with data entry, delays in authorizations and other glitches. New York State is working on these glitches that are affecting every county's EI program.
- Nursing has been vaccinating school aged children to prevent them from being excluded from school and to help prevent them from vaccine preventable diseases.
- PHN attended the Regional Communicable Disease meeting.

- PHN and Health Educator completed an Adult Immunization Provider visit at Apalachin Family • Care, looking at the practice's adult immunization rates and discussed ways to increase them.
- Dental Van saw a total of 217 kids at the Waverly Middle/High School and Elm St. Elementary. We continue to see a large amount of decay due to lack of brushing and/or flossing at home and poor diet.
- Director of Dental Services attended an I4A training "Stepping into Supervision." •

Administrative Services

- Director of Admin Services presented Public Health's budget and fiscal activities at October's Board of Health meeting.
- Deputy Director presented at the New York State Cancer Consortium meeting about Tioga County's adoption of Sun Safety Policy.
- Policy and work procedure were finalized for the new electronic payment application, Municipay.
- Administrative hearing was held October 8th for respondents of the Tioga Castings Property and Board of Health Order
