APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Approval of March 5, 2023 minutes:

Legislator Roberts made the motion, seconded by Legislator Standinger, to approve the February 6, 2024 Public Safety minutes, as written. Motion carried.

PROBATION - Brian Cain:

FINANCIAL

- Expenditures are on track
- \$2,362.99 in restitution and surcharge collected in February 2024.

NEW BUSINESS:

- One open Probation Officer 1 position remains unfilled. One application has been received and an interview is in the process of being scheduled.
- The most recently hired Probation Officer, Patrick VanDurme has been scheduled to attend Fundamentals of Probation Practice and Basic Course for Peace Officer training in the spring. He is scheduled to attend in Rochester from March 22 to April 19, and at Alfred University from May 14-June 28. Housing at Alfred is a Townhouse Apartment at a cost of \$50/week. The course is tailored to Probation vs. law enforcement.
- IPads, keyboards and pens have been received from the awarded DCJS grant. TCIT Dept. is providing training/tutorials.
- Quality Assurance (audit program) Admin staff at Probation have developed a rough draft of the Quality Assurance Program which will be put into place by June of 2024. Admin staff have reviewed multiple plans from various Probation Departments around the state and created a program which should work well in Tioga County. Admin staff will continue to refine the program during the coming months. Tioga County performed a trial audit which

County Attorney Legislative Clerk Assistant Coordinator – Emergency Services have already resulted in some policy changes within the Department. Ip appears the formal audit process will be beneficial to improving efficiency and effectiveness throughout the Department.

- Two Probation Officers and one Probation Assistant have been assigned to complete the Pre-Sentence investigation regarding the arson at the Tioga Downs horse barn. More individuals have been released on Pre-Trial Release in regard to the on-going Tompkins County kidnapping/murder case, and we anticipate another extensive investigation in regard to the recent murder arrest from the alleged domestic violence murder in Apalachin. These cases, in addition to the more than dozen justice courts sending us investigation orders have all officers very busy.
- Tioga County Spring Clean-Up Day organized by Sister Mary O'Brien of Tioga County Rural Ministries will be Saturday, April 13, 2024. Last year Probation and Court personnel teamed up to participate in the cleanup day with fantastic results. Brobation intends to try to organize another team effort this year.
- There were two Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets received for the month of February. Both respondents were charged with Assault in the Third Degree and Menacing in the Third Degree, Misdemeanors after attacking another student at school. Due to the issue of physical violence in the school setting, the matters were referred to the County Attorney's Office for petition to Family Court.
- Electronic Monitoring There are currently two individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app and GPS electronic monitoring system, AlcoTag systems.
- 51 active Court Ordered investigations for Tioga County Courts(Criminal/Family/Surrogate)
- 175 supervision cases ordered by TC Courts & Family Court
- 9 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending in Criminal and Family court.

- Communications Project:
 - 2/10/24, the Fire/EMS side of the radio system went down for several hours. Capital Area Communications responded and worked to get the system back online. During that time, dispatch could not hear or transmit to any Fire/EMS unit.
 - The Spencer lease has now been signed. Motorola has provided lease exhibits for the landowners to review with specific drawings.
 - Motorola on-site visit to confirm the status of the project and ensure that we are on track to move forward as the weather allows.

FIRE:

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Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report April 2, 2024

Budget Status:

2024 Revenue Budget:

- \$770 of DWI Supervision fee collected in March. \$2,670 collected in 2024
- \$1,994.25 in restitution and surcharge collected in March. \$7,711.24 collected to date in 2024

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer I position remains unfilled. One interview has been completed with at least one if not two more interviews anticipated.
- 2. Training The most recently hired Probation Officer, Patrick Van Durme, is currently attending Fundamentals of Probation Practice (FPP) training in Rochester. Following his completion of FPP he will attend Basic Course for Peace Officer (BCPO) training in May and June at Alfred University.

On March 12, 2024, all Tioga County Probation Officers in addition to some Broome County Probation Officers attended a one-day Disability Awareness Training for Probation Officers at the Tioga Downs Convention Center. The training was organized by the Tioga County Employment Center.

From March 26-28, 2024, two probation Officers attended Decision Points Facilitator Training in Albany. Decision Points is an Evidence Based intervention used with youth in an attempt to help them make better decisions and avoid involvement with the Juvenile Justice System. Decision Points is the backbone of Probation's attempt to address issues with students within our schools prior to the issues escalating to the point of law enforcement intervention. With multiple Officers trained, it should enable Probation to offer Decision Points at more than one location. Probation now has four Officers trained as Decision Points facilitators.

From May 21-23, 2024, all Probation Officers will be attending a three-day training at the Tioga County Sheriff's Office being organized by the Tioga County Threat Assessment Management (TAM) Team and the Domestic Terrorism Prevention Unit. Probation Officers will complete the Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (TERC) in anticipation of their participation on the Tioga County Threat Advisory Committee in the future.

3. In December of 2023, Probation received a Reward Notice from the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) indicating Probation was awarded \$60,000 to spend toward the cost of providing Pre-Trial Services in Tioga County. Tioga County received the money in January. IT Director Loveland is in the process of ordering lpads for each officer in the department as well as administrators and one to be shared by secretarial staff who attend court appearances with Supervisors and take notes. In addition, money has been designated for use of enhanced electronic monitoring systems, five years of payment for the internet service required for the lpads, and gasoline for the vehicles used to attend court.

Update: The iPads, keyboards, and pens have been delivered and are in use. Director Loveland provided a tutorial for all Officers at the Probation Department regarding iPads set up and use which was very helpful. Protective tote bags have also been distributed to all Officers for the devices. Officers report using the iPads at Court, during field contacts, during meetings and in the office. Many officers have already commented on the time it saves them during the workday.

- 4. All Probation staff attended a First Aid/CPR course at the Sheriff's Office on March 21, 2024. The course was taught by Roy Schreiner of the TCSO. Following the course, Probation presented Roy with a plaque in appreciation of his 30 years of partnering with Probation in many aspects of community corrections. A luncheon followed in Roy's honor.
- 5. Probation upgraded all its Electronic Monitoring equipment in March. Buddi provided Probation with replacement Generation 5 technology at no additional cost. This new technology will provide the most accurate monitoring possible over multiple networks. Previous Generation 3 and 4 technologies only utilized one cellular service network which severely impacted reliability in certain areas of Tioga County.
- 6. Tioga County Spring Clean-Up Day organized by Sister Mary O'Brien of Tioga County Rural Ministries will be Saturday, April 13, 2024. Probation is organizing a team to participate in the Spring Clean-Up Day again this year.

7. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

March of 2024- There were three Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDAT) received for the month of March. Two respondents (both 17 yrs. old) were charged with Unlawfully Fleeing a Police Officer when they rode away from a police officer on their motorcycles after being signaled to stop. The third respondent (13 yrs. old) damaged property in his grandmother's home. Probation is currently deciding whether to divert these matters from possible petition in Family Court or refer them to the County Attorney's Office for possible petition.

YTD: 3 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, -- Five (5) youths have been screened in 2024. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, all five (5) youths were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Zero (0) youth were found to be level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. Zero (0) youth were found to be level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Zero (0) youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There is one youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently two individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP will be cancelled for the second week due to a lag in orders sentencing defendants to perform community service. Probation has addressed this issue with the District Attorney's Office and the Courts. It is anticipated this will be a short-lived hiatus. WWP is also being used as a graduated sanction on Probation Violations.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 23 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 54 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 176 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 11 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
