AGENCY REPORT

September 21-October 25, 2023

<u>Highlights</u>

- Tamie was nominated Employee of the Third Quarter!
- Stephen changed roles from Temporary Public Health Educator to Public Health Fellow and is training in some new areas.
- The COVID After Action Report is underway, completing key informant interviews, receiving feedback from staff surveys and facilitated discussions with staff to be able to identify how we can prepare for the next public Health emergency.
- Kylie, Nick and Stephen participated in the Healthy Families PACT Program's trunk or treat, dressing up to promote rabies messaging and handing out heathy veggie chips and toothbrushes to almost 200 kids! We won the Spookiest Trunk award!!

Health Education

- Conducted two CarFit virtual trainings with Tioga Opportunities (TOI) staff and volunteers of Police Services-Cicero PD and held a CarFit event in partnership with TOI.
- Completed car seat training for new DSS employees, and had five car seat appointments from the public. New educational materials were printed to be able to hand out during appointments and outreach events.
- Building relationships with Emergency Preparedness Coordinators from Onondaga and Broome County to partner in holding trainings for Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) Units.
- Held Narcan training at A New Hope Center for staff, providing two Public Access Narcan Boxes. Also held Narcan tabletop training for Health and Human Services Security Guards.
- Met with Broome County CHSC team, Town of Tioga, and Village of Nichols, to discuss potential projects for Creating Health Schools and Communities (CHSC) Grant.
- Health Educators and Public Health Fellows delivered lead educational placemat coloring sheets and crayons to 14 local restaurants in recognition of Lead Poisoning Prevention Week.
- Continue to ensure follow-up services are provided to children on caseload. Now we are in new grant year and working on 2023-2024 workplan.
- In Maternal/Child Outreach, continue to make phone calls to mothers with high-risk pregnancies and new moms. Welcome baby packets were mailed to all new parents/caregivers .
- All Educators virtually attended the Statewide Health Educators Meeting. Several Educators also attended ASAP Coalition meeting which was a kickoff event for Year 6-10 of the Drug Free Communities Grant.
- Tabled at Health Fair hosted by Tioga Opportunities held at Tioga Downs.

Environmental Health

- Actively canvassing for Public Health Sanitarian. Due to this vacancy, duties have changed in the Environmental Health program to be able to adjust.
- We hosted our last rabies clinic of the year at Campville Fire Station and had a great turn out vaccinating over 120 pets! We received very nice compliments from a member of the community who attended.
- A Sanitarian attended Mitigation processes discussion/share meeting with county, town and village officials regarding flooding and other disasters.
- We hosted a Water Operator's training which had 22 attendees from Tioga, Broome and Chemung counties.

• Identified flavored vapes for sale within the County and issued enforcement.

Patient Services (El, Dental, Clinic)

- Early Intervention Service Coordinators continue to face an ongoing shortage of providers for El children who continue to have to wait for therapy services, including doing initial evaluations to determine eligibility for the program. Additionally, children needing to transition to special education preschool programs are also on waitlists and face the possibility of delay in transitioning to CPSE. Service Coordinators routinely reach out to potential providers; they console and support the families they work with who are angry that their children are not receiving services.
- For the first time, dental van staff worked with Waverly Middle School nurse and transportation department to get school children to the van for follow up services at other Waverly School locations.
- Received great feedback from patient surveys about their dental van experiences to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the Tioga Smiles Program; also interviewed with WBNG and WICZ regarding this! With help from Health Ed., Tioga Smiles Dental Van was recognized through Facebook campaign highlighting this patient feedback.
- Nursing completed multiple vaccinations for children needing vaccines for school requirements. Our clinic currently has flu and COVID vaccine available to residents who meet VFC/VFA requirements. Held flu clinics for Public Health staff, and continue to reserve Thursday afternoons for immunization clinic appointments for the public.
- Conducted an MPox clinic in partnership with Southern Tier Aids Program (STAP) and Tioga Opportunities' Family Services.
- Conducted adult immunization visits at UHS Candor and UHS Newark Valley to provide technical assistance in boosting immunization rates.
- Nursing attended meet & greets with Riverview and Elderwood nursing homes to help rebuild relationships, offer outreach and inform on infection control practices.
- Staff from NYSDOH-Communicable Disease came for a meet & greet with our staff to build back relationships and provide valuable information.
- Several staff attended the Annual Central New York Adult Immunization Coalition Meeting and Central Region communicable disease meeting.

- PHD attended Public Health Leaders' Summit.
- Implemented electronic Telework Log form for department use.
- Met with Tioga Opportunities to "renew" partnership and discuss collaborations.

Tioga Smiles mobile dental program celebrates 20th anniversary

celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Tioga Smiles Mobile Dental Program.

The program started serving the county in October of 2003, and has since seen over 17,000 patients in the past 20 years.

The mobile dental program was put together in response to the identified need for additional dental services in the county, with the goal of reducing transportation barriers for area residents.

The program's mission of "striving to ensure the oral health of the community by promoting proper oral health care, preventing oral diseases, and protecting vulnerable populations from access to care disparities" best describes the program's focus.

In response to the designation by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) as a Dental Professional Shortage Area in 1997, which continues to this day, and the well-documented barriers to oral health care, the Tioga County Legislature applied for and received grant funds for the creation of the mobile dental program.

The mobile dental program is made possible by the dental professionals working on the program and the unit itself. The staff includes a dental director, dentist, dental hygienist and dental assistant.

The original mobile dental unit

Tioga County Public Health is was a 53-footlong trailer that was used for 15 years until it was replaced by a smaller, drivable vehicle in 2019.

The current mobile unit has two dental chairs, office space, and a waiting area.

Tioga Smiles Mobile Dental Program serves both adults and children at various locations

functions as a school-based dental clinic serving children right at their school building during the school year. Adults are welcome to use the services of the program during non-school hours and school breaks. Dental services provided include dental screenings, cleanings, fluoride

throughout the county. It treatments, sealants, fillings and extractions.

Tioga County Public Health Department notes that they "are proud to address dental health disparities by offering the Tioga Smiles Dental Program."

The program accepts all dental insurances including Medicaid, plus it also offers a sliding fee scale

for those without dental insurance. Its services are designed to help to prevent oral health conditions including dental decay and periodontal disease as well as to promote good oral hygiene.
