APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER MINUTES

Motion by Legislator Brown, second by Legislator Standinger, all in favor, carried.

FINANCIAL

YTD Budget Report was presented.

OLD BUSINESS

See August minutes.

Election Inspector assignment letters for Early Voting and Election Day have been sent, 165 total inspectors assigned to work.

Military/UOCAVA absentees sent September 22nd, total of 14. Permanent and Civilian absentee ballots mailed September 29th, total of 683.

BOE Facebook page was launched Sept. 28th, with new VoteTioga Logo. The logo was designed by BOE staff.

The Cease and Desist Order to NY Citizens' Audit by the Office of Attorney General was presented, regarding the individuals associated with that group who have been impersonating county election officials around the state and falsely accusing people of crimes.

NEW BUSINESS

Research on how to pay and train election inspectors continues, especially after new legislation mandating that NYSBOE develop a uniform training curriculum for election inspectors, and a train-the-trainer program that county BOEs must send staff to attend. Commissioners must determine the impact on current staff and whether work hours and job descriptions must be adjusted.

Due to the public nature of our building, and especially with the increased number of people that come through for Early Voting, an AED was installed in our area of the building, and BOE staff received AED training. We will also receive Narcan training in October.

The number of absentee voters at Elderwood nursing facility in Waverly has surpassed 25. Per state Election Law, when there are 25 or more eligible absentee voters at an adult care facility, BOE staff must personally and bipartisanly deliver the absentee ballots to these voters and assist them with voting as needed. Deputy commissioners will visit on Oct. 12th to help residents complete voter registration forms and absentee applications, and commissioners will visit on Oct. 25th to deliver the ballots.

Early Voting begins October 28th and runs through November 5th.

There will be one polling site change as Richford Town Hall has moved. We are sending postcard notices to affected voters.

Commissioner Layman's retirement date set to 12/2/2023.

Deputy Kelly Johnson to succeed as Republican Commissioner, effective 12/3/2023.

RESOLUTION NO. -23 AUTHORIZATION TO PURCHASE NINE (9) VOTING MACHINES

WHEREAS: The Tioga County Board of Elections currently utilizes eight (8) Dominion ImageCast Precinct (ICP) scanners as part of our current fleet of voting machines; and

WHEREAS: These ICP scanners are 14 years old and reaching end-of-life, and the Board of Elections has deemed it necessary to replace these scanners with the new State-approved ICP2 model, and add an additional scanner to our fleet, to reduce the risk of equipment failure and facilitate a better voting experience for Tioga County voters; and

WHEREAS: The equipment will be purchased through OGS State contract and the total expense of the equipment is quoted at \$46,765.80; and

WHEREAS: The expense is fully reimbursable to Tioga County under the Technology Innovation and Election Resource (TIER) grant, per certified Resolution No. 247-23 and 383-23; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Board of Elections is authorized to expend \$46,765.80 for nine (9) Dominion ImageCast Precinct 2 scanners, including one metal ballot box for the ninth scanner, out of Capital Election Expense fund H1450-520490.

RESOLUTION NO. -23 ELECTION INSPECTOR (SEASONAL) POSITIONS BOARD OF ELECTIONS

WHEREAS: Legislative approval is required for the creation of any new positions within Tioga County; and

WHEREAS: The IRS is requiring election workers to be reported as employees due to new regulations. Previously they were paid with a 1099; and

WHEREAS: It was decided amongst the Board of Elections, Personnel, Treasurer's Office, and the County Attorney that Tioga County will need to create a new county job title, Election Inspector (Seasonal); and

WHEREAS: Due to the unknown number of Election Inspector (Seasonal) positions that are needed, it is recommended to create 230 with the ability to unfund extra positions if needed; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That 230 Election Inspector (Seasonal) positions be created and may be filled as needed without a resolution required per person, at a 2024 hourly rate of \$15.00; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Board of Election's 2024 authorized part-time headcount shall increase from 10 to 240.
