#### WIOA Youth Employment Program/Workforce:

- WIOA Youth Employment program PY-24 has begun with Rolling enrollment with 1-on-1 career exploration, work readiness and financial literacy for youth 16 to 24 with barriers to employment.
- Currently 34 clients rolled-over from PY23, plus 30 persons in follow-up. 14 new clients with 4 in review (75% of the required 25 participants per year), with 5 individuals homeless requiring more assistance. Case load is high with referrals continuing to come in.
- *Work Experience:* (4) Youth currently participating at Open Door Mission, Tioga Co. Career Center, Bloodnick Family Farm and Thunderbird Atalatll.
- College Enrollment: (8) clients engaged and Vocational Education Preparation (9) clients engaged
- Success Stories: GED celebrations for 2 individuals in July, (4) Clients obtained employment, (2) participants in Oneonta Job Corps, (1) enrolling in Glenmont culinary program, Recent participant returning home from National Guard receiving assistance to apply to local Electrician Union and (1) youth who utilized GED and Vocational training (welding) leaves for basic training (Marines) in Aug.

FRC Staff continue to provide Summer Programming highlighting outdoor activities and collaborating with Ag Educator Kelly Jackson at Waverly Glen, Candor & Berkshire Libraries and TC Boys & Girls Club.
