DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The incumbent is responsible for direct supervision of individuals selected to complete a public health fellowship at Tioga County Health Department. This position will coordinate all aspects of the fellowship resulting in the fellows gaining knowledge and experience of a local health department during its pandemic response. The primary function of this position is to oversee the implementation of the NYSPHC Fellowship program and coordination of local fellows. The secondary function is to complete and report grant objectives and activities as required by grantor. Work is performed under the direct supervision of the Public Health Director. Does related work as required.

- Interviews prospective fellows;
- Organize and implement a comprehensive onboarding plan;
- Develop, design and test training material;
- Create a work plan and evaluation method for fellows that will develop their professional skills;
- Serve as a daily COVID leader for the case investigation/contact tracing activities;
- Complete all grant related reports and budgets;
- Communicate with the designated Regional Coordinator.
