AGENCY REPORT

November 21-December 25, 2024

<u>Highlights</u>

- Nicole Whitmore, Mel Miller and Mark Griep graduated from Institute for Advancement (I4A)!
- Staff participated in a panel discussion with SUNY Broome students on prevention work in Tioga County. There were about 15 students that were in attendance. Staff highlighted the Tioga ASAP coalition, prevention initiatives and provided students with some examples of promotional items and outreach work.
- The End of Year Recognition for Public Health staff was a success! Thank you to Employee Recognition Committee for planning and coordinating!
- Employee Recognition Committee hosted a great Holiday Spirit Week, thank you Katie W. for facilitating activities! Congratulations to the Dental Van crew on winning the movie-themed decorating contest!

Health Education

- Health Educators, who attended the National Emerging Drug Trends Conference in October, presented their findings from the conference to the ASAP Coalition.
- Staff attended the "Coalition's Rising" virtual conference which focused on using environmental scans as a data collection tool, working in rural communities on suicide prevention, and working with businesses to enhance prevention efforts.
- Staff interviewed with WICZ on the Great American Smokeout and discussed the need for continued tobacco prevention work in Tioga County.
- Provided 25 lock boxes to United Health Services' Methadone Clinic for their Tioga County residents.
- Public Health Emergency Preparedness Coordinator attended the Health Emergency Preparedness Coalition (HEPC) meeting in Syracuse.
- In our Welcome Baby Program, this month we placed one successful referral to PACT and shared information on Mothers & Babies' smoking cessation program.

Environmental Health

- Hosted a Lunch'n'Learn for Tioga County Code Enforcement Officers titled "Public Health & Code Enforcement-Working Together," where staff presented on lead paint hazards, water, septic program, rabies exposures and public health nuisances to share about our work and identify areas for collaboration to make our communities safer and healthier. It was very well attended.
- Environmental Health staff attended a webinar training on inspecting breweries and supermarkets.
- New York State- Environmental representative for the water program conducted additional onsite training for our staff.
- We have a new water operator in the Town of Owego.

Patient Services (El, Dental, Clinic)

- Early Intervention Service Coordinators delivered educational holiday stockings to children in our Early Intervention program.
- Service Coordinators continue to advocate for the children in our program and continue to show
 resilience in spite of NYSDOH's EI Hub system. Additionally, due to the provider shortage our Service
 Coordinators have been doing more outreach to providers and having to provide explanations to
 parents.
- Grant evaluators from Eastern Tennessee University came to evaluate our dental program and learn how the funds we received from the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) benefited the

community. Their evaluation included interviewing program participants, school administration, county staff, including a few of our own staff members.

- As part of Quality Improvement project to improve the security on the dental van, Captain Yaegar from the Sheriff's Department did a walk-through of the dental van and recommend several security measures. The Quality Assurance Team will continue to develop a safety plan.
- Tioga Smiles hosted a Tioga Central Kindergarten class for a tour of the dental van, learning the sights and sounds of a dental office and discussed ways to have a healthy smile.
- Public Health Nurse (PHN) has been busy following up on Pertussis cases in the county to ensure that close contacts have access to post-exposure prophylaxis and educating on several prevention tips. It is now considered an outbreak in Tioga County.
- Along with Pertussis, we have seen an uptick in sexually transmitted infections, COVID and flu are on the rise, and we have seen a decrease in tick borne diseases.
- PHN conducted her first CPR and basic first aid training with two of our staff members.

Administrative Services

- Senior staff presented program updates to Board of Health at November meeting.
- Director of Admin Services presented on the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH)-Public Health Infrastructure Grant (PHIG) conference call sharing our approach and success using the PHIG funds with other New York counties.
- Our Quality Assurance Improvement Team is actively working on quality enhancement projects and is making progress with the department's initiative to implement electronic forms by developing an e-application for Temporary Food Permits.
- PHD attended NYSACHO Membership Meeting in Albany.

RESOLUTION NO. -25 AMEND EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK: SECTION IV. PERSONNEL RULES; SUBSECTION j., MANAGEMENT/CONFIDENTIAL BENEFITS; PARAGRAPH II. A. LEAVE ACCRUALS, VACATION

WHEREAS: County Policy (Employee Handbook Section IV. Personnel Rules; Subsection j. Management /Confidential Benefits: Paragraph II. A. Leave Accruals, Vacation) states the full-time employment requirement for Paid Time Off (PTO) for Management/Confidential staff; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County Public Health (TCPH) has Non-Union and Non-Management/Confidential part-time Dentist positions that do not accrue any PTO per the full-time requirement; and

WHEREAS: TCPH seeks to provide PTO to their incumbent part-time Dentist that has been with TCPH since the inception of the Dental Van in 2003; and

WHEREAS: TCPH desires this to ensure viability of the continuation of the Dental program for Tioga County residents and school children; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County has been designated as a Dental Health Professional Shortage Area by the Federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA); and

WHEREAS: In addition to the shortage designation, in Tioga County there is currently a shortage of Dentists that will accept or provide services to patients with either Medicaid or no insurance, leaving the TCPH Dental Van as the only option for many in our communities; and

WHEREAS: TCPH's Dental Van is currently backlogged with scheduling Dentist appointments for needed restorative care identified during the Dental Hygienists screenings and imaging; and

WHEREAS: TCPH's Dental Van requires a collaborative agreement with a Dentist to allow services to be provided and billed for under their license; and

WHEREAS: Although not required or mandated, the incumbent part-time Dentist has willingly and graciously signed a collaborative agreement each year since 2003 for the operation of the Dental Van to continue; and WHEREAS: TCPH has made numerous attempts to find additional part-time Dentists over the years, yet many factors have prevented these being filled, largely limited interest to work on a mobile unit, lack of a "good match" and an unwillingness to sign a collaborative agreement with TCPH; and

WHEREAS: TCPH is in dire need of additional Dentist hours to meet the demand of the mandated Dentist appointments following screenings, cleanings and imaging; and

WHEREAS: The incumbent part-time Dentist has expressed a willingness to commit to working additional hours to meet the needs of the Dental Van and also to commit to the continuation of signing a collaborative agreement with TCPH for the duration of his employment; and

WHEREAS: TCPH requests that a revision to County Policy be made to allow PTO for Non-Union and Non-Management/Confidential part-time Dentists that have provided services on the TCPH Dental Van for over 20 years and commit to signing a collaborative agreement with TCPH; and

WHEREAS: The Legislature has directed TCPH, the County Personnel Officer and the County Administrator to work together to develop the proposed resolution and policy changes; and

WHEREAS: The incumbent part-time Dentist, Dr. Eric Sarnicola, would qualify for PTO under the proposed change in County Policy due to his provision of services on the Dental Van for over 20 years, thirteen of which have been as an employee, his commitment to working the additional hours and executing a collaborative agreement with TCPH; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That County Policy, specifically Employee Handbook Section IV. Personnel Rules; Subsection j. Management /Confidential Benefits: Paragraph II. A. Leave Accruals, Vacation, be amended effective January 13, 2025 with the addition of the following bullet:

• <u>Exception</u>: Part-time Dentists who have provided services for Tioga County for over 20 years that work 35 hours a pay period and commit to signing and continuing a collaborative agreement for billing and other services provided under their license are eligible for pro-rated vacation days of 50 percent of the amount that a full-time eligible employee would receive.

And be it further

RESOLVED: That the remainder of the Employee Handbook is unchanged; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the incumbent part-time Dentist, Dr. Eric Sarnicola, who meets the eligibility requirements of the proposed County Policy change, will have seven and one-half days of vacation (prorated amount from the 15 days for full-time) effective January 13, 2025.
