APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Approval of December 6, 2022 minutes postponed; recommending to be moved forward to full Legislator work session on 1/5/2023 due to lack of quorum at this time.

OFFICE of EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT – Director Mike Simmons:

FINANCIAL:

• Budget is on track.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Currently we have unofficial agreements with landowners for some of the new tower sites. Anderson Hill in Richford, Bobcat Road, (Roundtop Park) in Athens, PA, Dodge Road in Spencer and Babcock Road in Nichols. The Babcock Road site is planned to replace the Skyview Racetrack site and has better coverage. The County Attorney office will develop lease agreements with the land owners.
- Several staff travelled to Motorola's staging facility in Schaumberg Illinois on December 6-9, 2022. Our radio system had been assembled at the staging facility and connected to the Onondaga Core. We had the opportunity to operate and conduct functionality testing of the radio system. The system passed all the tests that were conducted. Following this testing phase, the equipment was disassembled, packaged, and shipped. We started receiving shipments of equipment during the week of December 12th.



January 3, 2023

- We have located a suitable building to provide secure storage for the duration of the project. The space provides a loading dock, is heated, alarmed and has video monitoring, 2500 sq. ft @ \$2,190/month.
- CAD Project: The State Police IT and Communications groups have been working to get the system installed in the State Police cars. Waiting on parts; modems, GPS, antennas are all on backorder.
- The position of Assistant Fire Coordinator/EMS has been posted
- Spring EMT classes are scheduled. Enrollment so far has been good, and we expect to have enough students to conduct classes.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Citizens Preparedness class will be held at the Spencer Van-Etten High School on January 14, 2023 1:00pm.
- The Threat Assessment Management Plan is complete and has been submitted to the State.
- FIRE: Emergency Services and Fire Chiefs are working together to develop a Tanker/Tender Task Force Plan to create pre-established groups of Fire Department Tankers who can respond together when needed to supply water for firefighting.

FINANCIAL:

Budget Status:

For 2022, Probation budgeted total revenue collection to be \$18,600. The total amount collected for 2022 was \$18,713. This is 1% greater than the budgeted amount.

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing the one open Probation Officer 1 position remains unfilled. The results of the June 2022 Civil Service exam were received, and we have asked Personnel to canvas the list created from the exam.
- 2. Training All Probation Officers completed their 21 hours of mandated training in 2022.
- 3. Probation is working to establish an MOU with **IPPC** Technologies. IPPC Technologies monitors the cell phones, computers and other devices that can access the Internet which probationers convicted of a sex offense possess. The proposed agreement has been forwarded to the County Attorney's Office for review.
- 4. The Probation Administrative Team is scheduled to meet on a weekly basis beginning in January of 2023 to complete the review and editing of all revised Departmental Policies and Procedures.
- 5. Changes in the structure and responsibilities within the Probation Department are underway to allow for the presentation of the Decision Points curriculum within certain identified Tioga County schools.
- 6. A series of four Job Readiness/Employment classes have been scheduled for February of 2023 in conjunction with the Tioga County Employment Center. Probation Officers are in the process of identifying individuals who will benefit from these classes scheduled for February 13, 2023, February 15, 2023, February 22, 2023, and February 27, 2023.

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Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report February 7, 2023

Budget Status:

2023 Revenue Budget:

- \$1,110 of DWI Supervision fee collected in January. \$1,110 collected to date in 2023
- \$730 in restitution and surcharge collected in January. \$730 collected to date in 2023

Current Business:

- Staffing Probation Officer Toby Foster unexpectedly resigned effective January 23, 2023. This leaves Probation with two unfilled Probation Officer I positions and no valid Civil Service list. The position has been advertised and the sole applicant will be interviewed on February 14, 2023. It is the intention to hire candidates provisionally until the next Civil Service test is given.
- 2. Training It appears that training will be a more significant cost than anticipated in 2023. With the unexpected resignation of Officer Foster and the need to fill yet another Probation Officer I position, the previously anticipated cost for training in 2023 will most likely double. Given the new training requirements which took effect January 1, 2023, requiring nine weeks of training instead of the traditional four weeks, Probation may have to seek additional funding for training in 2023 if virtual training options cannot be located.
- 3. As an enhancement to sex offender supervision in 2023, Probation is still working to establish a contract with IPPC Technologies. IPPC Technologies monitors the cell phones, computers and other devices that can access the internet which probationers convicted of a sex offense possess.
- 4. The Probation Administrative Team continues to meticulously review and finalize all Policies and Procedures. The target date to complete this project is March 30, 2023 as Part Time Supervisor Joy Bennett is retiring at the end of March 2023. It is also anticipated that the updated Policies and Procedures will be available electronically and not just in a paper version. This will be of particular use to newly hired Probation Officers who are required to take a copy of their department's Policies and Procedures to fundamentals training.
- 5. Changes in the structure and responsibilities within the Probation Department are underway given the recent staffing changes and the goals of the Department for 2023.
- 6. Unemployed probationers have been identified to participate in the Job Readiness/Employment classes have been scheduled for February of 2023 in conjunction with the Tioga County Employment Center. Unemployed but employable

probationers will benefit from these classes scheduled for February 13, 2023, February 15, 2023, February 22, 2023, and February 27, 2023.

- 7. Another focus of Probation in 2023 is to provide Officers with up to date technology available to assist them in their duties. To that end, Probation is exploring the purchasing of Ipads for all officers to enable them to access Caseload Explorer (Probation's case management tool), as well as forms, case notes, and other information necessary to effective supervise probationers when not at their desktop. Probation has had initial discussions with IT Director Loveland regarding this. It appears it may be possible within the constraints of the current Probation budget.
- 8. Probation currently purchases interactive journaling booklets from The Change Companies to work with juvenile delinquents referred to Probation. The booklets are an Evidence Based modality to address the various issues which the youth are struggling with when being referred to Probation. Probation is now exploring the option of purchasing The Change Companies' digital platform instead of the paper booklets. The advantage is the variety of modules available (for juveniles and adults) and the fact that this resource may be shared with the Department of Social Services if they believe it would be helpful when working with their Person In Need of Supervision (PINS) population. It also appears the expense may qualify for Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) funding which may reduce cost for enhanced services. Probation will be having additional discussions with IT, DSS, and The Change Companies in the near future regarding this possibility.

9. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

January of 2023- There was one Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDATs) received for the month of January. The youth was issued a Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Ticket for Criminal Mischief in the Fourth Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor. At intake, the youth exhibited significant mental health issues and was immediately referred to the crisis worker at Tioga County Department of Mental Hygiene. Given the apparent need for services, the matter was referred to the County Attorney's Office for possible petition to Family Court.

YTD: 1 JDAT received to date.

- E- Connect: There were no youth screen in January. Given the emergent mental health needs of the youth, she was immediately referred to the crisis worker at the Tioga County Department of Mental Hygiene.
- Probation continues to support and make referrals to ACBC as their Making Our Success Sustainable (M.O.S.S.) Program continues to grow.
- There are no youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

RESOLUTION NO. -23 RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TIOGA COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT AND CATALIS COURTS & LAND RECORDS, LLC f/k/a AUTOMON LLC TO PROVIDE SOFTWARE AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CASELOAD EXPLORER PRODUCT

WHEREAS: The Tioga County Legislature has approved contracts between Tioga County Probation Department and Catalis Court & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC since 2008; and

WHEREAS: Catalis Court & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC has changed their contract status with New York State, therefore the Tioga County Legislature is approving that the Probation Department can contract with Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon LLC as a sole source provider of Caseload Explorer, a software program that meets the qualifications of 9 NYCRR 345, which mandates Probation Departments to use a software program that automatically sends Presentence Investigation completed in the software program to the DCJS PSI Repository in Albany, NY. Caseload Explorer software is the only software in New York State that meets this criteria; and

WHEREAS: Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon, LLC has summited their yearly Maintenance Agreement to Tioga County Probation which consists of the base charge of \$5,298.34, plus a fee of \$259.47 per user. Probation has 17 registered users of the software, so the total cost for basic software maintenance for contract period of 3/25/2023 to 3/24/2024 is \$9,709.33; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Probation Director is approved to contract with Catalis Courts & Land Records, LLC f/k/a AutoMon, LLC as a sole source provider for software and maintenance costs in 2023 for Caseload Explorer and Ce Assessments in the amount of \$9,709.33.
