FINANCIAL:

Budget on track

OLD BUSINESS:

- Training Staff attended Atlas Onboarding training in April. Assistance in completing the Domestic Violence Risk Assessment as well as financial training as it pertains to Caseload Explorer were provided to other counties. The Tioga County Sheriff's Office has agreed to provide firearms recognition and safety training for Probation Officers. This training has been requested from other County Probation Departments as many probation Directors have expressed an interest in having their officers attend.
- Atlas Digital Platform Evidence based digital programs for use with both the adult and Juvenile populations in Tioga County. This is making journaling easier for youth vs.

adults and is a conversation starter for the Probation Officers to use with their probationers.

- Probation is exploring having one of our Officers certified as a court certified translator for Spanish and French.
- Probation staff volunteered at the Drug Take Back event in April. Planning to participate with a table at the OES Open House on May 17, 2025.
- Probation has purchased the Firesetting Risk Assessment Tool for Youth (FRAT-Y) to determine risk level for youth exhibiting these behaviors. Probation is surrently seeking a mental health partner to complete the assessment.
- Probation held a meeting with representatives from other Couply Departments to discuss the issues that would need to be addressed for Probation to become a partially armed Department. Currently 74% of Probation Departments in NYS are armed departments.
- Due to continued low numbers of Court Orders for community service on the Weekend Work Program, moving forward, in all cases where the defendant is physically able, completion of community service on the WWP will be part of the plea agreement.
- Five Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets received for April. The JDATs alleged the respondents committed acts which if committed by an adult would constitute the crimes of Arson, Burglary, Criminal Mischief, Assault, Harassment and Criminal Trespass.
- Electronic Monitoring: nine people being electronic monitored.
- Pre-Trial Release: 32 people are being supervised.
- Court Ordered Investigations: 52 active cases opened.
- Supervising: 175 people currently.
- Violations: 9 have violated.

OLD BUSINESS:

• Radio Project: Patriot has finished up the anchoring system for the tower in Richford. Tower should be complete by end of May. Nichols permitting has been resolved – will need to light that tower for the town, cost of approximately \$64,000. All equipment waws moved out of the warehouse to alternate secure locations. We have ended our lease with Weitsman's. DPW provided, forklift, low-boy and manpower to assist with move. We have received information for the Carmichael and Popple failed structural assessments. Carmichael seems standard, however, Popple was an exorbitant cost.

- Fleet mapping and talk-group committee meetings have been taking place to begin designing the channel layout of the new system.
- Frank Yoder has been catching up to speed as the consultant. He has continued to make great headway on the project, including contact information for the existing Spencer Tower site, permission for road access, locks, etc.
- The jail is staying on their stand-alone system. Their radios have been failing, and new ones were purchased. They will be operational in the next few weeks.
- CAD Project: Another EMS agency has joined the CAD system and mapping,
- EMS: Spring EMT classes have been moving along Finish up in May 2026. We will be reposting the Assistant Coordinator position that oversees EMS courses.
- Emergency Management: Corinne attended the Communications Symposium in Corning, NY with information presented including radio security and NYS security updates.
- The office is preparing for the Open House in May 17, from 10-2, weather permitting. The Lifenet Helicopter will be on site, and we have already gotten many table requests for different resources.
- The two new Tahoe's have been outfitted with lettering and all radios and lights. These vehicles are now response ready.
- Threat Assessment Team: Continuing to meet and hear cases; working to update their plan that is due June 1, 2025; Tioga is hosting the TERC course with NYS DHSES DTPU May 13-15 2025. 38 are registered.

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Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report June 3, 2025

Budget Status:

2025 Revenue Budget:

- \$810 of DWI Supervision fee collected in May. \$4,115 collected in 2025
- \$3,128 in restitution and surcharge collected in May. \$8,512.39 collected in 2025

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer position remains unfilled. Two applications have been received. The Civil Service Exam will be given this month.
- 2. Training Staff continue to work toward satisfying the mandatory 21 hours of training they must complete each year. In addition to relevant on-line trainings, staff have attended a variety of in-person trainings regarding drug trends, domestic violence, and supervising DWI offenders. Probation Officers will be permitted to attend a firearms training with the Tioga County Sheriff's Office during June.
- 3. Probation will be hosting our annual in-service training at Hickories Park on Wednesday June 18, 2025. The agency attending the in-service this year will be the Tompkins County Probation Department. Tompkins County Probation will be giving a presentation on the steps they took to successfully gain approval to partially arm their Department. The Agencies will also discuss ways in which our Departments may be able to share services.
- 4. Probation Director Cain will be attending the annual Council of Probation Administrators (COPA) conference in Saranac Lake from Sunday, June 22, 2025, to Wednesday, June 25, 2025. While Director Cain is out of the office, Probation Supervisor Chad Post will be designated as the person in charge of the Department. Supervisor Fred Kiechle will also be assisting him.
- 5. Probation staff volunteered at the Emergency Management Open House held on Saturday, May 17, 2025.
- 6. Probation would like to add a "Clothing" line in the existing Probation budget. It is the intention to provide a yearly allowance of \$200 per person who work "in the field" and \$100 per person for other staff. Staff are required to wear identifying clothing when "in the field" and all staff are required to wear identifying clothing with the public.
- 7. On April 23, 2025, Probation held a meeting with representatives from other County Departments (Tioga County Sheriff's Office, Personnel, County Attorney, Safety Officers, County Administrator, CSEA Union President) to discuss the issues that would need be addressed for Probation to become a partially armed Department. Currently, 74% of Probation Departments in New York State are armed Departments. Probation hopes to have a proposal to present to the Public Safety Committee some time in 2026 regarding this issue.

Update: Probation held an internal meeting to determine if there was sufficient interest by Probation staff to proceed with the arming process. The results of the meeting are still being evaluated.

8. Due to the continued low number of Court Orders for community service on the Weekend Work Program, Probation met with the District Attorney's Office to discuss the issue. It was agreed that moving forward, in all cases where the defendant is physically able, completion of community service on the WWP will be a part of the plea agreement as follows;

> Class E Felony Class D Felony Class C Felony and above

96 hours of community service on WWP 144 hours of community service on WWP 256 hours of community service on WWP

Update: Since the meeting with the District Attorney, the number of orders for individuals to complete community service on the Weekend Work Program has increased substantially. On the weekend of May 31, 2025, five individuals were scheduled to work on Saturday, and six individuals were scheduled to work on Sunday.

 Probation is still unable to secure staff willing to complete the fire setting assessment purchased by Probation to address recent fire setting behaviors of juveniles involved with the Family Court System.

10. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

May of 2025- There were six (6) Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Tickets (JDATs) received for the month of May. The JDATs alleged the respondents committed acts which if committed by an adult would constitute the crimes of Criminal Trespass, Criminal Mischief, and Harassment.

YTD: 18 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, seventeen (17) youth have been screened in 2025. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, seven (7) youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. Four (4) youth were found to be a level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. Six (6) youth was found to be a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. Zero (0) youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There are currently two youth participating in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently five (5) individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP has resumed with five and six individuals scheduled to report on Saturday and Sunday, May 31, 2025, and June 1, 2025, respectively.
- Pre-Trial Release There are 31 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 58 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 176 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 11 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
